We had our first flower at the end of May and we hope to see some ripe chillies before the summer term ends.

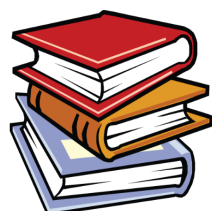


The class challenge is to see who can grow the most chillies by September!

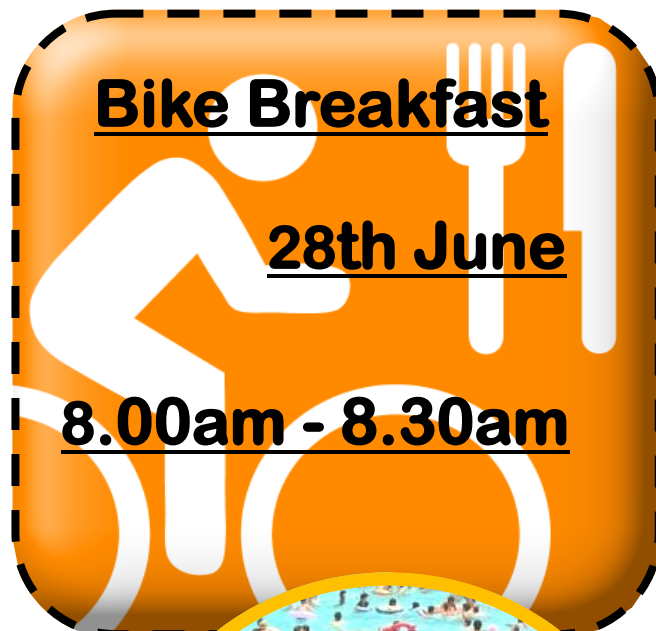

What have we learnt this week?

Reception

Reception have practised writing 'Super Sentences' by describing, drawing and writing about their favourite toy. In maths, we practised our learning about weight, capacity and measure. We also had some very tiny caterpillars arrive in our classrooms. We are excited to see what will happen to them next week! At home, ask your child to use full sentences to tell you what they noticed about the caterpillars and what they think will happen next.

Year 1

In literacy this week we wrote recounts about the aliens who travelled to Hannah More. Elmer class enjoyed their trip to The Matthew, where they continued learning about John Cabot. Gruffalo class enjoyed their trip to Andalusia where they learnt about Ramadan and respecting different beliefs. At home help your child by showing them different coins and making different amounts. This will support their learning in maths.

Year 2

In Literacy, we wrote recounts about our trip on the tour bus around Bristol. In maths, we solved addition and subtraction word problems. Our new topic is Grace Darling and we looked at different sources and used drama to find out about her heroic acts. At home, ask your child to tell you the sights they saw on their trip around Bristol.

Year 3

This week we practised measuring using rulers and metre sticks, and solved problems about mass. We also learned a 'good vs evil' story, 'The Clockwork Dragon'. At home, ask your child to retell you the story 'The Clockwork Dragon'.

Year 5

In Numeracy, we multiplied and divided to convert metric to imperial units. For example: 1 gallon = 4.5 litres. In Literacy, we created our own frog and began to write a non-chronological report. We focussed on adding detail in our paragraphs. In our Topic, we learnt about the Floating Harbour in Bristol and some of the rivers nearby. You can help your child by supporting them with multiplying and dividing by 10/100/1000.

Year 4

This week we explored our new Greek myth text, learning all about ancient Egyptians and entertainment, and making our own tour guides! In Maths, we represented data in bar charts and interpreted data! The children were really resilient! Please help your child to practise their 7, 8, 9 and 12 times tables! And ask them about Theseus and the Minotaur!

Year 6

In Maths, we solved complex word problems involving division and we also practised algebra. In Literacy, we wrote our own stories based on our class book 'The Boy Who Sailed the Ocean in an Armchair.' In topic, we researched the history of the Gardner Haskins building and the contribution of Bristol code-cracker Gordon Welchman. At home, please encourage your child to think of ideas and inspiration for our end of year leavers' performance.
