

Reception... have had a fun week and really enjoyed splash day and teddy bears picnic with Year One. They have been thinking about moving on to become Elmers and Gruffalos and have shown how mature and sensible they can be. We are all so proud of how well they have done in their first year at school! At home, Keep reading over the holidays! Use bug club and visit a library to find books you enjoy. Year 1... have had so much fun. Hannah More's Got Talent, Splash day and class parties have been just a few highlights. Amongst this fun we have also been writing riddles in English and making shape pictures in Maths. At home, ask your child to give you a riddle to solve about an animal.
