# Scarlet Fever



## SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS


- **Red rash.** The rash looks like a sunburn and feels like sandpaper. It normally begins on the face or neck and spreads to the body, arms and legs. If pressure is applied to the reddened skin, it will turn pale.
- **Red lines.** The folds of skin around the groin, armpits, elbows, knees and neck usually become a deeper red than the surrounding rash.
- **Flushed face.** The face may appear flushed with a pale ring around the mouth.
- **Strawberry tongue.** The tongue generally looks red and bumpy, and it's often covered with a white coating early in the disease.

## Talk to your doctor if your child has a sore throat with:

- A fever of 102 F (38.9 C) or higher
- Swollen or tender glands in the neck
- A red rash

# Measles

## Signs and Symptoms



*The symptoms of measles generally begin approximately seven to 14 days after a person is exposed to someone with measles, and include the following:*

- Blotchy rash
- Fever
- Cough
- Runny nose
- Red, watery eyes (conjunctivitis)
- Feeling run down, achy (malaise)
- Tiny white spots with bluish-white centers found inside the mouth (Koplik's spots)

Adults and older children can be vaccinated at any age if they haven't been fully vaccinated before.

Ask your GP about having the vaccination.

# What have we been learning?

*Reception.... we have been on a bug hunt and we caught snails, wood lice and worms. We have learnt how to use non-fiction books and the internet to research what minibeasts eat and where they sleep. In maths we have been practising doubling and halving numbers and solving problems. At home, please remember to go on bug club to read with you child every day. Go on a minibeast hunt near you home. What will you see?*

*Year 1... in Maths we have been telling the time to the nearest hour and half hour which a lot of the children have found challenging. Ibn Battuta has been our person from the past, do ask the children what happened to him and where he visited along the way. At home, help you child to tell the time on a clock.*

*Year 3... have been hard at work learning about different types of lines in maths, Ancient Egyptian gods in topic and writing recounts in role in English. At home, recap column addition and subtraction with your child.*

*Year 5... in English this week we wrote Trip Advisor reviews. In Maths, we described 2D and 3D shapes. We learned about the edges, vertices and faces that 3D shapes. At home, listen to your child read every day and asking them questions about their reading.*

*Year 6... Wow! What a busy week of learning. We started the week with our Into University transition morning. We drew pie charts in maths and wrote recounts in our English lessons. In history, we created huge timelines. On Wednesday, we welcomed Rachael and Jade from Arup who talked to us about engineering and we build towers made from spaghetti and marshmallows! Today we have mixed with year 5 and taken part in Operation Moonbase – take a look at Twitter for more details about all the above!*

*Year 2...have been writing engaging recounts of our class story 'The Tin Forest'. In Maths, they have been solving problems involving addition and subtraction and multiplication and division. We have also had visitors from Redland Green school watch our history lesson this week and they were incredibly impressed with the children's learning. Have a look on Twitter to see their lovely comments. At home, please ensure your child reads regularly*

*Year 4... have been learning all about shape. We have been noticing similarities and differences in triangles and quadrilaterals. In English, we have gotten to an exciting part of our book The Iron Man and so have started to look at the features of a newspaper report. At home, practice drawing symmetrical shapes.*
