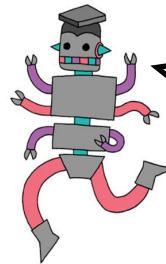
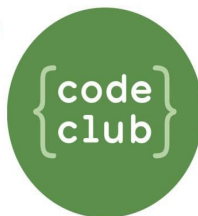
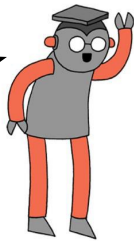
The Bristol Family Cycling Centre in Hengrove offer coaching sessions to help children to improve bike handling skills and to gain confidence in riding on the roads.

# What have we been learning?

## Year 1

We have been busy learning our information text about the dinosaur The Crake. In numeracy we have been learning our number bonds and working out 1 more or 1 less than a given number.

In our topic sessions we have been comparing the city and the countryside.

At home, find different ways to make 10. For example  $5+5$ ,  $7+3$ ,  $2+8$



## Year 2

We have been learning about instructions this week as Mrs Hall was turned into a toad using a special potion and we need to turn her back. In maths, we have been counting backwards using partitioning. We have also been comparing Hindu and Christian celebrations and noticing how similar they are. Please make sure that your child learns this week's spellings ready for the test on Monday.



## Year 3

This week we have been using the column method to subtract in Maths. In English, we have been getting to know our new text which is based on 'Diary of a Wimpy Kid'. Our topic this term is 'Bristol to Beijing' and we have been looking at maps of both cities and learning about compasses!



At home, please help your children to practise column subtraction.

## Year 4

This week Year 4 learned all about finding the perimeter of squares and rectangles. We used facts we already knew about these shapes to work out the answers quicker. In English, we really enjoyed a visit from a magician who introduced our class text for the term. At home, please support your child to practise the column method for addition and subtraction.



## Year 5

This week we have been looking at two-way tables and using our knowledge of them to fill in missing data. In topic, we are looking at forces and this week we planned an experiment to measure friction. In English we have been studying the biography of Alexander Graham Bell. At home, please make sure your child continues to read!



## Year 6

We have had a busy week this week; simplifying and ordering fractions in maths, unpicking and writing our own newspaper reports in English, learning about FairTrade in topic and continuing to read our class novel Skellig! We had a fab time ice skating on Wednesday and enjoying the Weston-Super-Mare sun! At home, please ask your child to name the features of a newspaper report.
