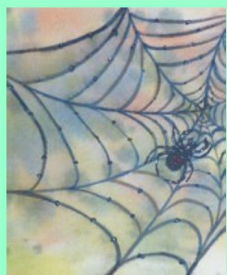

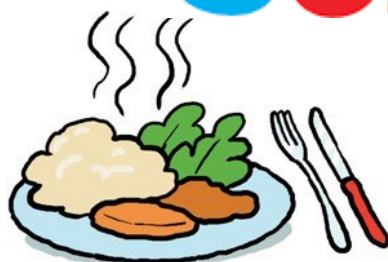

ALIVE N KICKING

What have we been learning?

Reception.... On Monday we went on a trip to the moon! We showed our tickets, put fuel in our spaceship engine and flew to the moon where we ate space crackers. We learnt about gravity and that there is only a little bit on the moon. We compared the moon's environment to Earth's and noticed that there are no trees, rivers or houses on the moon. We had a fantastic time exploring space in the Space dome. At home, look at the moon with your child and talk about what you can see. Please read with your child every day and practise sounds and tricky words.

Year 1... this week we wrote excellent descriptions about a scene from 'The Night Gardener' using adjectives and verbs to add detail. We learnt about the days and months in a year in Maths. In Topic, we found out how Rosa Parks stood up for what she believed in and helped change things for the better! **At home, please use coins and ask children to identify different amounts.**

Year 3... have been busy learning all about angles in Maths, how to make mummies in Topic and building tension in their writing in English. **At home, please encourage children to do more research on our Ancient Egypt topic.**

Year 5... In English this week we practised the skill of persuasion! We wrote persuasive speeches to our friend Edmund, trying to persuade him to make the right choices. **At home, please listen to your child read every day and ask them questions about their reading.**

Year 2... have been writing persuasive letters using lots of interesting description. In Maths, we looked at pictograms and block graphs and answered questions about these. As well as this, we created rainforest art and looked at historic sources linked to the SS Great Britain. **At home, please complete your homework challenge ready for our Hannah More Museum.**

Year 4... this week we presented and analysed data! We focused particularly on line graphs. In English, we wrote diary entries all from the perspective of Hogarth in The Iron Man. **At home, please read a variety of different types of books with your child.**

Year 6... we learnt about the different parts of a circle to prepare us for understanding data represented in a pie chart. In English, we looked at Part II of The Arrival, thinking carefully about description, thoughts and feelings. We also looked at different historical sources, particularly The Blitz in topic this week. **At home, ensure your child is still reading for 20 minutes every day and ask them about their book recommendations.**
