

## What have we learnt this week?

Reception classes... This week we learnt the story of the 'Little Red Hen'. We learnt about how bread is made and tasted different breads from around the world! On Thursday we visited a farm. The children fed lambs, watched a cow being milked and met very small piglets who were only 2 days old. The reception team were very proud of all the children. They were enthusiastic about their learning and they listened very well to their adults. At home, talk to your child about what they saw at the farm. Encourage them to use full sentences. Have you watched Numberblocks? This will help children with their learning in Maths.

- **Year 1...** In Literacy this week we wrote our own adventure stories. In Numeracy we added using repeated addition and solved multiplication and division word problems. In topic we learnt about different trees and thought about how we can protect the local environment. **You can help at home by using BUG CLUB with your child.**
- **Year 2...** This week we have been capitalising and making links in all our learning. We have worked extremely hard and have shown a mature and resilient attitude towards our learning all week. At home, please help your child at home by playing number bond and multiplication games on the 'topmarks' website.
- **Year 3**... In maths this week we started to think about statistics and using data. We looked at bar charts and pictograms and even created our own! In literacy, we created some fantastic characters and wrote about them going on an adventure! We also continued to practice hard for our performance. At home please help your child to practise their lines and song words for the performance.
- **Year 4...** This week we sorted 2D shapes using different criteria. In topic we looked at electrical circuits and planned an investigation on conductors. In literacy we wrote a newspaper report, as well as instructions on how to trap Nibbles, a little yellow monster. **At home, please help your children with story ideas for Nibbles in the city.**
- **Year 5**... In Numeracy this week we revised 3D shape names and their properties. We also revised finding angles in shapes. In Literacy, we enjoyed creating a storyboard for an adventure story called 'The Pirate Cruncher'. We were also busy at Into-University creating models using our learning on Geometry and Geography all linked together to work on a project! **At home, please support your child to read their book fluently, with expression**.
- **Year 6**... In Maths, we used calculators to convert fractions to decimals and explored when it is better to use a formal method. In literacy, we wrote recounts about our bowling trip last week. We also explored the fantastic 'Know Your Place' website on the iPads and looked at how the local area has changed. On Thursday, we were very lucky to attend a workshop run by Bristol Aerospace at the Bristol Energy hub on the harbourside. We built rockets and tested them out. **Please support your child to read regularly at home**.
