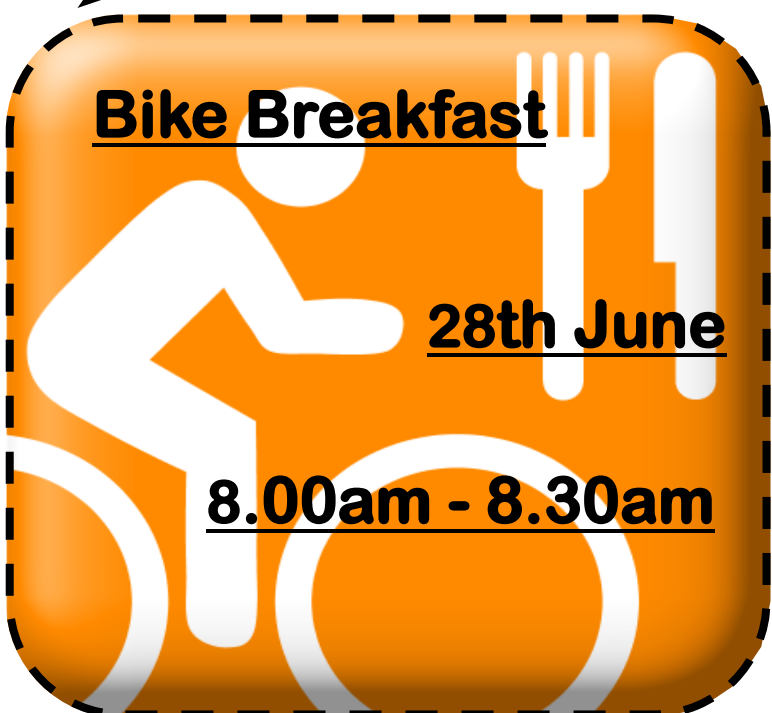

What have we learnt this week?

Reception

This week Ladybirds and Caterpillars were joined by real life Caterpillars and 12 Eggs! The children are waiting patiently for the caterpillars to turn into butterflies and chicks to hatch out of their eggs. We're learning about life cycles, what minibeasts and animals need to survive and what we can do to look after them. Please read with your child everyday. Talk with your child about how we can look after flowers and animals. Maybe go on a minibeast hunt together!!

Year 1

This week, we solved division and multiplication word problems. In literacy we designed alien characters and wrote recounts about our trip to planet Earth. In topic we learnt about the Wright Brothers. At home please support your child to practise their 2s, 5s and 10 times tables.

Year 2

In maths this week we worked on our multiplication and division facts. In Literacy we invented our own super hero story. During our topic this week we looked at real life hero Grace Darling and did some role play to help us visualise the stormy night she helped rescue 9 people from drowning. Please help your child to practice their multiplication and division facts for 2, 5, 10, 3 and 4 times tables.

Year 3

This week we learned about Egyptian pyramids and how they were built. In Maths we learned about g, kg, ml and l. We also practiced using money. In Literacy we innovated our class text 'Clockwork dragon'! At home, help your child to count and add money.

Year 5

In Numeracy this week the children learnt the prime number rule and solved true/false problems. In Literacy, we wrote a non-chronological report and spent a lot of time editing our vocabulary and sentence structures. We enjoyed a workshop from the NSPCC about keeping ourselves safe and making sensible choices. You can help your child by practising their times tables.

Year 4

This week we continued to learn about bar charts and pictograms. In literacy, we created news bulletins explaining how Theseus destroyed the Minotaur and in topic we looked at historical sources to compare entertainment in the past to modern day. Please help your child to practise number facts including addition facts and times tables.

Year 6

This week in maths we used rounding to estimate answers and then reflected on our accuracy. In literacy we wrote an interpretation of the The Three Little Pigs. The children showed great imagination and humour writing these stories. We spent Monday and Tuesday at IntoUniversity doing our secondary school transition workshops and enjoyed an informative NSPCC workshop where we thought about staying safe. At home, help your child with their homework which is to write a short script for our leavers performance.
