What have we learnt this week?

Reception classes ... On Monday we found parts of a fallen spaceship in the playground! We learnt about how astronauts live on the International Space Station and how they brush their teeth. We also made our own space rockets. We enjoyed the story of 'Whatever Next!'. At home, practise telling the story of 'Whatever Next!' with the actions. You could ask your child to draw a story map to show what happens. Encourage your child to use words like: 'Once upon a time', next, after that, finally.

Year 1 ... This week we looked at the poem 'The Sound Collector.' We created actions to match the poem and thought about the different sounds in the bag. In Maths, we continued learning about 2D and 3D shapes, learning the shape names and een saying why they are the same / different. You can help at home by spotting different shapes in real life (cuboids, cubes, cylinders, spheres)

Year 2... This week the children wrote reports about nocturnal animals. In maths they learned how to tell the time. During topic they explored different habitats and the different animals that live there. At home, please practise telling the time with your child and practise counting in 3s.

Year 3 ... This week we practised addition using the column method. In Literacy we learned about different types of poems. Lots of skipping in school this week as well!

You can help at home by asking your child about poems that they know and sharing some poems together.

Year 4 ... This week we looked at fantasy stories and revised what we learned last term. In Maths, we continued learning about money. In topic, we researched rivers and created fact files. We also had a skipping workshop that was great fun and really developed the children's perseverance skills, as well as their fitness. **Please support your child by practising using the column method for adding and subtracting**.

Year 5... This week Year 5 worked together as 'Dovowl' class because there has been a mix of both classes. The campers had a fantastic time — you can check out what they have been up to on Twitter. In class, we designed, created and evaluated our own roller coasters to enter into a competition to win a trip to Thorpe Park for our classes! Wish us luck! **You can help at home by supporting your child to practise their times tables. They should be able to recall them instantly!**

Year 6 ... This week we enjoyed an interesting trip to Bristol Zoo as part of our 'Evolution & Inheritance' topic. In maths we studied the properties of circles and constructed pie charts. In literacy we explored different types of poems and wrote own our using imagery. **Please help at home by practising times tables and basic number facts with your children**.
