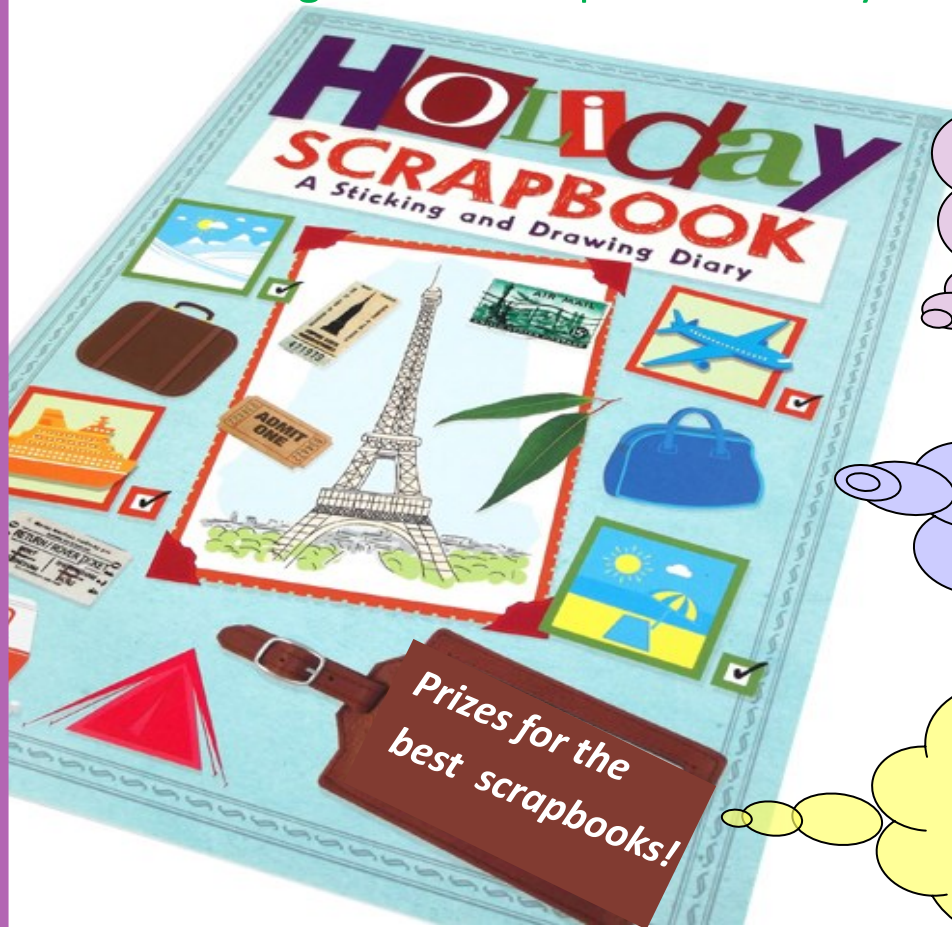


# SUMMER SCRAPBOOK CHALLENGE!

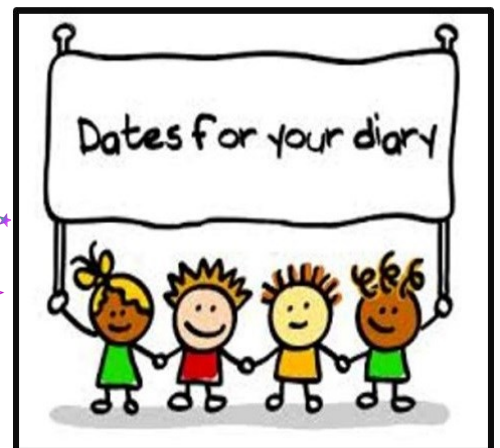

# This week's learning ...

**Reception classes ...** This week we thought about the rhyming words in our story 'The Train Ride'. We explored different rhyming words and looked at how we know they rhyme. In maths we learnt about sharing different quantities between different numbers of people. You can support your child's learning by sharing out different objects/food between the people in your family (e.g. cutting an apple into equal pieces or sharing out raisins).

**Year 1 ...** This week we measured the length of objects in the classroom and then compared the shortest to the longest. We also learnt about Neil Armstrong, and had a fantastic visit from the Space Dome. You can help at home by reading with your child and asking them questions about their book.

**Year 2...** This week we wrote our own mysterious creature adventure stories. In Maths we read different scales and learnt to tell the time. In Topic we learnt about the SS Great Britain and thought about the special celebrations Ramadan and Eid. **At home, please ask your child to 'upgrade' these words using a thesaurus: dark, sad, climb, hurry and small. Show your class teacher to earn a Gold card!**

**Year 3 ...** This week we measured capacity, mass and length using different measuring tools. In Literacy we learnt about crocodiles and wrote a non-chronological report using this information. We also learnt about Ramadan and Ancient Egyptian people. **At home, please ask your child to estimate the weight, length and capacity of different objects.**

**Year 4 ...** This week 14 members of Year 4 went to Camp with Miss Wright and Carol. We heard that they were having fun, playing lots of games, enjoying the outdoors, and learning all about Ancient Greece. The remaining Swift and Swallow children conducted some exciting measurement activities with Miss Low and Ms Sokoni. We also worked on improving our art skills through observational drawing and self-portraits. **Please support our learning by helping your child to measure ingredients for cooking.**

**Year 5...** This week we learnt all about pirates and the impact they had on Britain. We looked at historical sources, went on a trip and also conducted our own research. In Maths we looked at area and perimeter and applied our knowledge to some tricky problem solving questions. **Please ask your child about how we calculate the area and perimeter of shapes.**

**Year 6 ...** This week we learnt how Muslims celebrate the month of Ramadan and why this month is so important to them. In Literacy we worked collaboratively to create a classroom display on our author of the term: Elizabeth Laird. We continued to learn about how the city of Bristol developed from 1750 to 1820 and how these developments impacted on the lives of Bristolians. **Please help your child to learn the words for the concert songs off by heart.**
