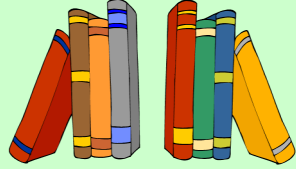

What have we learnt this week?

Reception

Not only did Reception complete their first 'Sports Day', but they also enjoyed 'Maths Day' too! They had to complete number challenges around the reception area which supported their learning. We can't wait for 'Shape Day'.



Year 1

In literacy, we enjoyed performing our poems. In numeracy, we had fun following a recipe to bake cakes. We enjoyed measuring the ingredients and decorating the cupcakes. In topic we were busy planting different plants and seeds.



Year 2

The children enjoyed writing different types of poem; including poems with alliteration and riddles. In maths, we developed our estimation skills by using clues, such as the size of containers and our halving knowledge.



Year 4

For Topic, the children enjoyed designing and making electronic games. In Literacy, we wrote some fantastic adventure stories. In Maths, we learned about symmetry. We really enjoyed sports day, as well as our reading for pleasure activities which were all around a lovely book called 'The Tin Forest'.

Year 3

We really enjoyed performing our version of the Jungle Book! We worked hard making the costumes, learning the songs and rehearsing our lines. We also recapped discussion texts and drew our own bar charts.



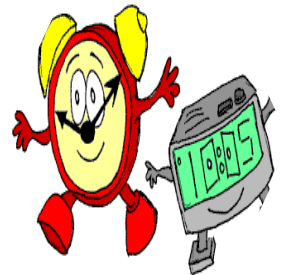
Year 5

It has been an unusual week this week with Mrs Irfan out for 3 days and Miss Wright out for 2 days. But the children got on with their learning with maturity: In Maths, they plotted coordinates on a grid and in Literacy, they wrote adventure stories. Year 5 enjoyed the sports day activities too!

Year 6



In Literacy, we wrote a setting description about a desert scene using our imagination. In Maths, we solved problems with pie charts and carried out a maths rounding investigation. We enjoyed 'reading for pleasure week' where we looked at visual literacy. In topic, we compared St Philips and the Temple Quay area between 1750 and 1828. We loved sports day and working as a team!
