What have we been learning?

Reception.... This week we learnt about money. We learnt what we need it for, we learnt about the different coins and how to find out how much money we have all together. We also watched our caterpillars grow and asked different types of questions to find out more.

At home, when you go shopping, ask your child to help count out the money that you need to buy an item.

Year 2...This week as mathematicians we continued to look at time. We have grown so good at it we have been reading the time on the clock for our teachers! As authors we predicted how Anna Hibiscus would finish and acted out our ideas. At home, please continue to read with your child every day. Practise learning the time with them.

Year 4... This week Year 4 visited Into University and learnt all about different careers (and got to try them out!). Both classes also had a class treat and got to enjoy some games in the sun. At home, practice your homework spellings to prepare for your spelling test. Year 1... This week Year 1 learnt how to tell the time in maths! We learnt the words o'clock and half past. We also wrote recounts in English as the Beast from our story. At home, please continue to read with your child every day. Ask them what the time is – using o'clock and half past. AND - make sure you complete your homework.

Year 3... This week as mathematicians we explored angles in shapes. As authors they we practised our story writing skills and as scientists we began to consider how healthy we are - and we explored different food. At home, please continue to read with your child every day. Practise learning the time with them.

Year 5... This week we calculated missing angles on lines and in some shapes. We also wrote our own versions of 'the next chapter' of our class book, using skills such as: show not tell, figurative language, varied sentence starters and including a balance of action, description and dialogue. As part of our Enquiry, the children learnt about habitats and how some animals adapt to their environment.

At home, please Support your child to practise how to measure angles accurately using a protractor.

Year 6... This week we had a first look at our leavers' performance (which is on Mon 22nd July) script! The children also started to design their own theme park, considering budget, promotion and layout. This week we gained some sketching skills as artists and developed our swimming abilities too! Please read through the performance script with your child!
