This week we used adjectives in sentences to describe nouns. In maths we used our number bonds to ten to help with subtraction. We also started learning about 'fact families'. Help at home by practising your number bonds to ten, and using them to help with subtraction. Watch the videos on the Lavender Class blog page and log in to your Epic Books account to read!

On World Book Day we really enjoyed hearing the story of 'Little Red and the Very Hungry Lion'. In Maths we enjoyed the story 'Superworm' and learnt about long, tall and short. In PSED we thought about our feelings and Summer showed us how to make a 'calm jar'. At home draw around your hand or foot. Can you find things around your house that are longer or shorter? Take a photo and put it on Tapestry. Keep practising your sounds and words on your mats and keep reading!

This week we explored our new outside area and thought about how we can move, climb, balance and use role play in our new area. In maths we learnt numbers to 50 and in English we described characters from the story 'Toys in Space'. Help at home by talking about your favourite books/ characters. Can you create a character description for your favourite book character?

We learnt about statistics this week in maths and we can now interpret pictograms and block diagrams. We had an exciting day yesterday for World Book Day reading Little Red and creating crazy outfits for the lion which we then described! As scientists, we learnt about animals and the adaptations which make them suited to their habitats. Please make sure your child reads 5 times a week. Let us know if you need help logging in or new books on Bug Club. Practise your 10s, 2s and 5 times tables on TTRS.

This week we explored perimeter as mathematicians. We had an exciting day yesterday for World Book Day reading Little Red and the Very Hungry Lion and taking photos of ourselves reading in unusual places. Please make sure your child is reading 5 times a week on bug club. We can't wait to see you all next week!


This week we did experiments as scientists (take a look at Twitter), looking at changing between the states of matter. We also thought about the characters in our book 'The Song of the Dolphin Boy' and some of the decisions they will have to make. The Thos of us in school thought about how we can welcome our lovely classmates back on Monday! We can't wait to see you! Help at home by encouraging your child to share their favourite story with you and to keep reading every evening before bed. Keep practising times tables too!

This week we multiplied fractions as mathematicians. As authors, we read 'The Explorer' and created guides for surviving in the Amazon. Additionally, webecame illustrators as part of World Book Day yesterday. Please make sure your child is reading 3 times a week on bug club. Remember: Chromebooks need to be brought back in their boxes, with the correct charger, on Monday.

We have had a great week with lots of different things happening. We had RE day, World Book Day and continued planning our Greek Myths that we

will write next week back in school. As mathematicians we practised our calculation skills and recapped earlier learning. Please make sure your child brings any reading books back to school so that we can issue new ones next week.
