Hello everyone

For the past two weeks the children have been focusing on the concept of community - what makes a good one, how we can all play our part and how our school values help with this. I know that the works being carried out on New Kingsley Rd and Jubilee Street have added to the difficulty. They are installing a new district heat network - which will eventually provide heat created by renewable energy directly to all the new buildings locally and to school as part of the city's aim to be carbon neutral by 2030.

A message from the Reception team ...

Thank you so much for your support this week, especially at the start and end of sessions. This year has been so different - usually we love welcoming parents into classrooms and into school. This year we have had to do things very differently, but we are hugely impressed with how well children have settled in. Next week Reception children will come to school every morning, through the pupil gate. On Monday-Wednesday



they need to be collected at 1.00 from the same gate (leaving the same way). On Thursday and Friday they will do full days, so at the end

of the day parents should collect children by coming in through the ball court (on Jubilee street) and then leaving by the pupil gate. This one-way system helps us to maintain social distancing and our 'bubble' system.

Driving to school

If possible, please walk or cycle to school. If you need to drive, there is a **one-way system for cars** at the beginning and end of the school day only. You need to arrive via Louisa street, then turn right into Jubilee street, then leave by turning right into Horton street. **Please don't turn your car round in Jubilee street.**

If your child is in Year 3 or above you won't get free lunches unless you have registered for them. If you receive benefits you may be eligible. Children in Reception, year 1 and 2 receive a 'universal free meal' - but the school still gets important extra funding if you register! Apply online to find out:

This week everyone settled in to school, explored the classroom and made new friends. Miss Vintin and Mrs Evans say it was fantastic to meet everyone and they were so pleased with the way everyone joined in.

This week Year 3 were brilliant mathematicians and started working with 100s numbers. We also had fun making videos for our twin classes. At home, please read with your child every day and practise the 2,5,3 and 4 times tables.

This week we wrote diary entries and worked on our community project. The children worked together to design and paint a 'buddy bench' for the school. Keep your eyes peeled for them on the playground next week. We were also fantastic mathematicians and artists. Please help at home by reading with your child **every day** and practising times -tables.



We have thought about what a community is and how we can make others feel welcome. We have talked about number facts for different numbers. At home, talk with your child about the community you live in and how you welcome visitors. Please keep practising sounds from last year as well.

This week Year 2 were brilliant mathematicians. We worked on our tens and our ones. We also made some 'be kind' pebbles for our partner classes in year 4! At home, please read with your child every day and practise counting to 100.

Year 4 had an exciting week starting to paint the playpod for our community project. We also started learning maths again by reminding ourselves about hundreds, tens and ones. We've done lots of art too and we are so impressed with the children! Please help at home by reading with your child and encouraging them to practice times tables.

This week Year 6 wrote some beautiful poems about trees using figurative language. We also created mixed media artwork based on our book 'Wangari's Trees of Peace'. These are beautiful and the children took great care over them. Next week we begin our Enquiry



with a trip to the Living Rainforest – make sure your trip letter has been returned! Please support your child's learning by encouraging them to read at home every day.
