Hello everyone,

I have always loved the word 'penultimate' meaning last but one. We have come to the end of the penultimate week in school. The Year 6 children are nearing the end of their Hannah More journey. They have been working hard on their play and I am excited about seeing it next week. The children have loved the art activities that they have been doing and I know that many of you will have enjoyed the exhibition this afternoon.

I have been out on training with other Headteachers and some of the work has been around trying to improve outcomes for all children. Historically, Bristol has let down some children. There is recognition that parents of children with additional needs - such as Autism - have been let down by the system. It often takes parents too long to get a diagnosis, and therefore the help that children need. There is recognition that it is harder for some families to even navigate the system and this often makes things unfair.

We had a productive parent voice session on Monday. It was great to talk about the children, the curriculum and the learning. Parents were open and honest about their experiences trying to help children at home. We can see that there is lots more that we can do. I have attached some notes for everyone who couldn't make it.

It is with mixed emotions that I have to let the school community know that Naimah Mahmood will be taking a year out of school for personal reasons. She was due to be moving to Year 3 next year. We will be interviewing for a replacement teacher during the holidays. Also, Soumia Seradj - both governor and LSA - will be leaving at the end of the year. Soumia does so much for the school and we are very grateful. She has recently stepped down from the governors and we thank her for everything she has done. She will be having a baby at the end of the year and we wish her well.

As you all know Sarah is leaving the office. Unfortunately, we are also going to be losing her husband Michael from the governing body. Michael has been a governor here for 30 years. He has been a great support to me in my first year as a Headteacher. He has so much knowledge and experience. Rest and retirement is well earned and we all wish him the best.

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CLASS NEWS

LAVENDER This week as artist we created artwork related to our trip last week to The While Place Project and painted some very colourful animals! As mathematicians we revised telling the time to and past the hour. We also enjoyed watching The Deadly 60 and learnt about dangerous animals! At home, ask your child about the things they enjoyed doing in Lavender this year.

RECEPTION Reception enjoyed their new story 'Billy's Bucket' and drew what they thought they might find in their magic bucket. We enjoyed making bubble pictures as part of Arts Week. Please return all reading books to school next week. We will be giving out some words to practise reading over the holidays next week. Have you joined the library? Do visit and borrow some books to enjoy over the summer!

YEAR This week we learnt about Africa. We pretended to be different African animals, listened to tinga tales, painted an African scene, made African necklaces, designed African clothes and learnt about African masks. We have been busy! Please return any borrowed Hannah More story books and phonics books if you have not done so yet.

YEAR 2 What fantastic art work we have seen in Year 2 this week - animal collages, totem poles, Mexican mirrors and rainsticks. In our study of North American arts, we also learnt about blues music. At home, please read with your child 5 times a week. Use Bug Club - ask your teacher if you have forgotten your login. Practise your 3 and 4 times table, including doing them out of order.

YEAR 3 This week Year 3 had fun learning about Oceania for Arts Week. We did weaving, dot painting, used oil pastels and made Lamington Cake. We also had an amazing time with Travelling Kitchen, cooking up a delicious feast which we all enjoyed on Wednesday. Please read with your child 5 times a week. Learn the 3, 4 and 8 times table facts out of order. Practise joined handwriting at home.

CAN We were very creative this week! From creating Chinese dragons and Japanese cherry blossom scrolls, to producing Asian inspired music and roleplays of Mulan - we enjoyed Arts Week a lot! As well as that, we worked in our new Year 5 classroom and visited IntoUniversity. At home, help your child complete their final round of homework, and get them ready for a week of fun and games as we finish our year in Swift class.

Year 5 did some fantastic writing this week, imagining they are tadpoles and frogs! They continued their mathematicians work on units of measurement. We also explored the art of South America and used watercolours and crayons to make a variety of artworks. At home, keep encouraging your child to read at home.

YEAR O This week, Year 6 worked hard to get their performance together for next Wednesday! They had a lovely 'fun swim' at Easton for their last swimming session - they even got to use the slide! We also looked at Europe for Arts Week, we studied St Basil's Cathedral and Polish folk art. At home, keep encouraging your child to read at home.

Clean Air Zone

Individuals who earn less than £30,000 a year (previously £27,000) are now eligible for financial assistance to help change their vehicle to one that won't be charged in the zone. Businesses with 5 or more vehicles can also now get financial support for their fleet.

What financial support is still available?

Financial support can significantly reduce the cost of replacing or adapting vehicles that don't meet the zone's emissions standards.

This will be a grant, a contribution towards the interest on a loan, or a combination of both. You could get up to £2,000 for a car and up to £4,500 for a van.

Check your eligibility and apply online.

lunches will cost £2.70

Some people may be entitled to Free School Meals. If you have not already applied, you can check your eligibility and apply at:

Apply for a £50 supermarket voucher or a voucher for gas/electric top-up at a paypoint. Greggs charity are providing these to support some Hannah More families. You do not need to be eligible for free school meals. You do need to answer all the questions.

Parent Voice Meeting – 10.07.23

Focus of the meeting: Homework and helping parents to help children outside of school.

<u>Homework</u>

Several parents spoke about homework club and how it used to be run after school on a Thursday to help parents and children with homework. This could be run by volunteers or staff. It works well because parents can support their children and speak to teachers about areas they need help with.

A lot of parents talked about the Maths and how they find that the methods are so different from how they were taught. This makes it hard to help children at home. Some ideas are;

Leaders to make videos explaining the methods used at school Parents invited in to watch lessons or learn from the school staff

Book changing

Parents talked about books only being changed once a week. Could children change their own book? A parent suggested that there are other ways to read – such as a Kindle.

School can look into how books are changed

Communication with teachers

A parent suggested that we could have a teacher email that they can contact when they need to communicate something to the teacher. Parents feel that they don't get a chance to speak to the teachers enough.

One of the parents suggested a mini report each term. This would be difficult to do in terms of workload.

- School will consider the amount of teacher parent meetings and whether we can increase these. Parents will get feedback on children's strengths and weaknesses each term so that they know what they can work on.
- Parent meetings will now be at the start of the year, the beginning of Term 3 (after the first set of data) and the beginning of Term 5 (after the second set of data). This will help parents to know exactly which areas need work.

It transpired that the MarvellousMe communication is not consistent across the classes. Some parents receive a lot more activities and badges that others.

We will revisit the expectations in September. As a school we want parents to get lots of positive messages about what children are doing at school.

Behaviour

At the end of the meeting one of the parents spoke about behaviour. We didn't get a chance to discuss this. Parents were unhappy because some parents are still approaching children themselves rather than letting school deal with it.

The code of conduct does state that parents cannot approach children. It says:

Approaching someone else's child in order to chastise them because of their actions.


