We enjoyed a wonderful trip to Bristol Aquarium where we had the opportunity to learn all about the different sea animals and even fed the fish. At home ask your child to tell you about their trip to the aquarium! Please also practise the spellings sent home on Friday and share a story with your child.

Reception had a great time in Arts Week. We read the story 'Lost and Found' and learnt all about Antarctica. We made our own penguins and tried building igloos out of sugar cubes. We also really enjoyed our samba workshop. I wonder what else you could find our about Antarctica? Can you think of your own crafty project to complete? Keep reading stories in the holidays - why not join your local library to find more books to enjoy.

This week we went on a trip to Wild Place to finish off our learning in enquiry this term! We saw cheetahs, giraffes and brown bears, and enjoyed the sunshine! As artists we explored Africa for Art Week and made some fantastic African masks, tribal necklaces, sunset painting of the Savannah and even made and tasted an African fruit salad. Please continue to practise number bonds to 20 so children are fluent ready for Year 2. Continue to read every day for 15 minutes on their own or out loud.

What fantastic art work we saw this week in Year 2, with animal collages, totem poles, Mexican mirrors and rainsticks. In our study of North American arts we learnt about blues music and made Mexican tacos! Please complete a holiday diary over the summer. Learn all the times table facts for the 2, 3, 5 and 10 times table out of order. Keep remembering to tell the time. Encourage reading every day for 15 minutes on their own or out loud.

Throughout Arts Week we learnt all about the continent of Asia. We created art work in the form of Chinese paper dragons, batik fabric art and Indian Rangoli elephants. We also played traditional Chinese music on glockenspiels and performed dance using Asian routines. Please make sure your child continues to read and practise their times tables over the summer holidays, while also being rested and relaxed before returning in September!

Our creative juices were flowing during Arts Week, we were painters, sculptors, textiles artists and more. We also showed our musical side with an amazing samba performance. Have a wonderful and restful summer holidays!

This week was Arts Week. Year 6 looked at different art from across Europe and studied Gaudi, created watercolour paintings, mosaic coasters and replicated Polish folk art using collage techniques. We are in full swing with our performance practice. Please make sure your child has their costume in school for the performance on Tuesday.
