Hello everyone,

We continue to be impressed with how smart the children are looking in their uniform. Can I remind parents that football kits shouldn't be worn for PE. On their two PE days (1 for Reception and Year One), children should wear black leggings, shorts or tracksuit bottoms and a house t shirt – or plain t shirt of that colour. PE clothes can be bought online through the school website or at most supermarkets. The change to two PE sessions – one of which is taught by the class teacher- has been well received. Children are talking enthusiastically about PE.

Next week, there will be a parent voice meeting on Monday afternoon at 2.30 in the community room. In our recent survey, some parents felt that school didn't do enough to promote British values. I wonder if we aren't doing enough to make parents aware how they fit into our curriculum. Democracy is practised through our school parliament structure. Mutual respect and tolerance for those with different faiths and beliefs is such an important part of our Hannah More community and something integral to our curriculum. Individual liberty and freedom to make choices feature in much of the work that we do to ensure that children can choose future careers that are right for them. I always welcome the chance to hear your views face to face so please join us.

I hope that you have all managed to make an appointment to meet with your child's new teacher. These meetings are so important when trying to ensure that the relationship between child and teacher is successful. As parents, you can give us so much information about your child's likes and interests. It is a chance to share information with the teacher that might be fundamental to your child's learning. If you haven't got an appointment next week, please ask the teachers.

This week, we met with the team who are going to be developing the site over the road at the old Gardner Haskins site. You will find a letter about the development in this newsletter and we will email it out to all families. Although there will be considerable disruption – including the closure of Russ street –

the building work shouldn't impact the school too much. It is a long project and will be going on for several years. We should be able to give the children some exciting opportunities to be involved along the way.

Parent Voice meeting

We will focus on British Values - Do we do enough in school to communicate these to children?



Year 1: Anab Year 2: Adia Year 3: Shayan Year 4: Yusuf and Hamza Year 5: Nabiila Year 6: Amahra and Jamal **YEAR 1** This week we read 'The Snail and the Whale' and thought about adjectives and verbs. As mathematicians, we sorted objects in different ways. At home, please talk to your child about different animals and where they live.

Year 2 This week Year 2 enjoyed reading their new book 'The Tin Forest'. They made predictions about what would happen, looked at the new vocabulary and has a go at sketching different leaves you might find in a forest. Please read with your child <u>5 times a</u> week. Practise counting forwards and backwards from 100. Practise writing numbers with your children.

SEAR 3 This week, as scientists, we explored natural and artificial light and how it is reflected. We conducted our own experiments with torches and mirrors to see how the light rays travel as well as investigating which areas of the classroom has the most light. In maths, we looked at ways to represent 1000 using dienes and counters. In English we described settings and used similes. Please read with your child <u>4 times a week</u> at home.

We had a jam-packed week starting the Year 4 curriculum. Our new book 'Varjak Paw' has inspired some excellent character descriptions and diary entries. As mathematicians we explored the place value of numbers up to 1000. We also enjoyed our first swimming session. At home please read with your child at least 3 times a week. You can also practise their times tables with them or log onto TT Rockstars.

This week we began our curriculum proper with a bang! As authors, we explored character description in our new story 'Kick' and used relative clauses to add extra detail in our own. As mathematicians we went into further depths with tenths, partitioning, adding and subtracting. We began our new enquiry with a trade game, using budgets and importing and exporting goods as foreign countries. At home discuss the origins of products in your home, identifying where different goods and services can be found.

Year 6 dove straight into maths and English this week, starting with place value up to ten million and gathering information about beetles ready to write a non-chronological report next week! In P.E. we played cricket and showed great sportsmanship. At home please ensure your child completes their first homework assignment.

Applying for school places 2024-25

A guide for **parents and carers** on applying for a **primary school** place for the school year **2024–2025**

If your child was born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020 you will need to apply for a school place by 15 January 2024



What do I need to do to apply for a school place?

- Check the guidance on applying for schools - available at www.bristol. gov.uk/schooladmissions, or by contacting School Admissions. The guidance contains details on how & when to apply, information on each school along with their admissions policy and oversubscription criteria. With the mix of different types of school from Church schools, Foundation schools, Academies, Free Schools and Community schools the admissions policy could be different for each school you put as a preference so it's important to ensure you check this carefully.
- Some schools require supplementary forms to be completed as well as the common application form. Make sure you check if this applies to the school(s) you are interested in.
- Visit the schools. All schools hold open days. Contact the school directly for further details on open days.
- Look at the school's prospectus and its website which are useful sources of information.
- You can name up to three school preferences. We advise you to name more than one school.
- Make sure you apply on-time. The deadline is 15 January 2024.

Why apply online?

- The system helps you by checking for errors.
- There is no risk that your application will be lost in the post.
- It is quick and easy to do.
- You will get an immediate email confirming that your application has been received.
- You will receive an email notification of the outcome of your application on the same day as the offer letters are posted.
- The system is available 24 hours a day until the final submission time of midnight on 15 January 2024.

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

No

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
