This week we had a visit from some dental nurses, they taught us all about teeth. As philosophers we learnt about Diwali and made diya lamps using clay and firework paintings to show the significance of light. As authors, we wrote stories and as mathematicians we split wholes into parts e.g. there are 4 cars, 2 are blue and 2 are red. At home, practise the new sounds we learnt this week.

This week Year 2 explored the features of a narrative using some of the exciting adventures of Traction Man. We experimented with different materials and the best ways of joining them together. In maths, we learnt about finding 10 more and 10 less. We also learnt a lovely song for Kindness Week, which we enjoyed performing at Celebration Assembly on Friday. Please read with your child 5 times a week. Practise number bonds to 10 - ask your child to teach you the 10s game! Practise counting in 2s, 3s and 5s.

This week Year 3 learnt about tectonic plates and estimated what the world would look like in 50 million years. We also learnt how to label the layers of the earth. In English, we looked at home to organise paragraphs within our writing. In maths, we looked at using our times tables knowledge to help us work out militplication questions and word problems. Please read with your child 3 times a week at home. Please make sure your child does the homework sheet.

We started the week with RE Day. Year 4 enjoyed learning about how Hindus worship. We then answered inference questions on what we had learnt, and we researched shrines. We brushed up on our 3, 6 and 9 times tables and division facts. Please read with your child at least 3 times a week. Practise 9 times table and division facts out of order.

We began multiplying numbers by two-digits using long multiplication in our maths lessons. As authors, we stepped into our theatrical shoes as we were reading in role, acting in roles and writing in roles from our story 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe'. This has been super helpful as we upped the ante on performance practice, ready to hit the boards for the first time Monday. At home, please make sure your child is reading eighteen minutes, three times a week - recording in their green reading records.

Year 6 were busy mathematicians this week, learning about long division and BIDMAS! As writers, we were sentence stacking and used some incredible vocabulary. We also focused on kindness and created some games for our friends in Year 3. At home please ensure your child practises their 10 homework spellings ready for the Thursday test.





Applying for Reception 2024-25 places



What do I need to do to apply for a school place?

- Check the guidance on applying for schools - available at www.bristol. gov.uk/schooladmissions, or by contacting School Admissions. The guidance contains details on how & when to apply, information on each school along with their admissions policy and oversubscription criteria. With the mix of different types of school from Church schools, Foundation schools, Academies, Free Schools and Community schools the admissions policy could be different for each school you put as a preference so it's important to ensure you check this carefully.
- Some schools require supplementary forms to be completed as well as the common application form. Make sure you check if this applies to the school(s) you are interested in.
- Visit the schools. All schools hold open days. Contact the school directly for further details on open days.
- Look at the school's prospectus and its website which are useful sources of information.
- You can name up to three school preferences. We advise you to name more than one school.
- Make sure you apply on-time. The deadline is 15 January 2024.

- It is quick and easy to do.
- You will get an immediate email confirming that your application has been received.
- You will receive an email notification of the outcome of your application on the same day as the offer letters are posted.
- The system is available 24 hours a day until the final submission time of midnight on 15 January 2024.
