CLASS NEWS

This week we wrapped up warm and used the new outdoor classroom to learn all about trees. We also wrote about the animals we could find in the woods to teach Reception class some facts. As mathematicians, we found one more and one less. You can help at home by ensuring your child forms their numbers correctly.

This week Year 2 worked really hard completing their reading and maths assessments. In maths we subtracted 2-digit numbers across 10. We used our engineering skills to construct our own playground equipment for Traction Man - his playground looks really fun! Please read with your child 5 times a week. Practise number bonds to 10 - ask your child to teach you the 10s game! Practise counting in 2s, 3s and 5s.

This week Year 3 worked really hard through their assessments in reading and maths. We also looked at our 3 times tables. We practised our hockey and rugby skills in PE whilst learning more about the history of the earth in enquiry. Please read with your child 3 times a week at home. Please make sure your child does the homework sheet.

Year 4 impressed us with their focus and determination during assessment week. They tried their best in maths, writing and reading tests, and kept going even when they got stuck. At swimming, they were also assessed. Lots of them have made incredible progress and are now swimming whole widths and lengths. As scientists we researched why certain habitats come under natural and man-made threats. Please read with your child at least 3 times a week. Practise 7, 11 and 12 times table and division facts out of order.

This week we were busy with assessments, showing off our maths, reading and writing knowledge. We also learnt to use short division (bus stop method) in maths and parenthesis as authors. Practise on our performance continued too - just two weeks to go now! At home, please ask your child to show off their new skills as mathematicians and authors.

This week Year 6 worked really hard completing their reading and maths assessments. We saw great progress from all the children! We also wrote our versions of the Nowhere Emporium and the children were really creative with their ideas! At home please encourage your child to read at least 3 times for 18 minutes each time.



We welcome trans and nonbinary children who may feel more comfortable in a girls-only space.






