Hello everyone,

There has been a lot in the news about the NEU (National Union for Education) striking. They have announced four days of industrial action;

Wednesday 1st February

Thursday 2nd March

Wednesday 15th March

Thursday 16th March

It is likely that there will be disruption on these dates, which may include having to close some classes. I am working closely with the staff to get a clear impression of the impact that this will have on the school. I am very aware that parents will want to know as soon as possible so that they can arrange childcare if needed. It is important to note that teachers in the NEU don't have to inform me if they are going to strike before the 1st, although I get the impression most will let me know. I will write to you next week with details of any closures or changes.

I think it is important to know why teachers are striking. Although it is about pay, it is also about the excessive workload that has been created as a product of the lack of funding for schools. When we met on the inset day, parents noted that teachers have to deal with so much beyond teaching and learning. The lack of funding for social care means that schools are increasingly responsible for ensuing that children and their families are safe and looked after. The funding provided doesn't match the increased costs of staffing, which can impact on the number of staff that schools can employ.

I would like to thank so many parents for coming to the RSE meeting on Tuesday. It was good to have the conversations around what children are taught and explore areas that might be more challenging from different faith perspectives. For me, the most important thing is having the conversations and working together. We aim to involve parents as much as possible.

This week we learnt about 'what makes a fairytale?'. We came up with our own fairytale sentences and used adjectives to describe settings. As mathematicians we learnt the 4 times table. At home, please practise the 4 times table.

YEAR 1

Year 1 were very lucky to have a group of firefighters visit in their fire engine on Thursday! The firefighters told us where they get their water from and how they safely put out fires. At home, give your child three numbers between 0-20. Ask them to order them from smallest to biggest. Keep reading!

Year 2 had a great time visiting Felix Road Playground. We enjoyed a range of different play equipment and materials. In English we sequenced parts of the story 'Traction Man' and in maths we moved onto multiplication and division. In jigsaw we learnt about caring for others, keeping clean and life cycles. Please read with you child 5 times a week. Practise your 2, 5 and 10 times tables, including doing them out of order.

YEAR 3

This week we used adjectives to write descriptions of settings and characters for our quest story! As mathematicians we continued dividing big numbers and we started learning about mechanical systems in DT! Please read with your child 5 times a week. Learn the 3, 4 and 8 times table facts out of order. Practise joined-up handwriting at home.

As mathematicians, we multiplied two and three digit numbers using the column method. As authors, we reminded ourselves how to use inverted commas, and we planned and wrote newspaper reports. In our enquiry we continue practising our end of term performance while beginning to create our art sculptures. At home help your child learn their lines for the performance.

YEAR 5

This week as mathematicians, the children continued to solve multiplication problems and became confident with the expanded method. As authors they used 'show not tell' to describe a character and wrote a fantastic piece of text using action, description and dialogue. As scientists, we continued exploring our solar system and learnt about air resistance, water resistance and the earth's gravitational pull. At home, help your child with their homework and spellings ready for our Monday test.

This week, Year 6 explored great speeches in preparation for writing our own persuasive texts. We looked at Martin Luther King and Winston Churchill and examined not just what they said, but their body language as well. Needless to say, we have some great orators in our year group! In maths we began to look at algebra - not as daunting as they first thought! At home, help your child for at least 10 minutes each day. Go through the learning packs to practise maths and reading questions.


