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On the subject of achievement, I have mentioned in both the assemblies this week how proud we are of the year 6 children. The teachers have done a fantastic job this year and the Year 6 results are testament to this.

Year 4 did very well in the multiplication check. 21 of the 27 children got more than 20 out of 25. 34% of the class got full marks. The national average is 27%!

The Year 1 children did well in their phonics with 78% of children passing the test. Children retake the test in Year 2. This year 75% of the year 2s passed second time round. Well done!

The staff have worked hard to get these results, especially when you consider that several of these children have missed large chunks of school during Covid.

We received some sad news this morning. Mowahib, a girl who left Hannah More in 2021 has sadly passed away. She had a heart condition which sadly took her yesterday. I know that many people in our Hannah More community will know the family. Our thoughts are with the family. This only serves to remind us how precious life is and how much it should be cherished and enjoyed.

Lastly, can I thank the Hannah More community for supporting me through my first year here. I will always try and do my best for the children. I won't always get things right and I know that I will make mistakes along the way. I will always give my all and I will always listen. The important thing for me is that we all work together.
