YEAR 1

This week we were introduced to Black History Month and learnt about Rosa Parks and the Bus Boycott. We learnt about what equality means and that things were not fair in the past. We acted out the story of the Bus Boycott and created signs protesting for equal rights for everybody. The Year 1 children are exhausted after working so hard this term. Over half term, make sure your child has a good rest and extra sleep to prepare them for term 2. Please keep reading with your child! Enjoy your half term.

Year 2

This week Year 2 performed amazingly in their play - Little Red Riding Hood!

As authors they wrote letters and as mathematicians they looked at addition and subtraction. Please read with your child five times a week, practise counting forwards and backwards from 100 and practise writing numbers with your child.

YEAR 3

This week in Year 3 we continued learning the column method as mathematicians. We also wrote fantastic instructions to make a shadow puppet. On Friday we had our class treat and celebrated with an autumn party. Please read with your child 5 times a week over the holidays. Learn the 3 times table facts out of order. Write an autumn story!

Year 4

As mathematicians we continued our work with column addition and begun looking at column subtraction too. As authors we finished and wrote up our reports about early Islamic civilisation, ready to be presented in our museum later today! Please help your child practise the 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 10 times tables, getting ready for our Year 4 Multiplication Table Check later this year.

YEAR 5

This week was Black History Week, we learnt all about the slave trade and Edward Colston. Year 5 children had a debate based on the question 'Is Edward Colston a hero?' They were very mature and focused on the topic making fantastic points and backing them up with evidence! Although maths was a little tricky this week, the children stayed focused and determined to understand the new concepts taught. At home help your child with their homework and spellings ready for our Monday test and get them on Times Table Rock Stars! They should all have their login details stuck in their homework books.

Year 6

As historians, Year 6 learnt all about Windrush and the impact it had on our nation. We challenged ourselves as mathematicians with some tricky long multiplication and became real authors by writing full adventure stories. At home please encourage your child to practise their times tables at home on TTRockstars!

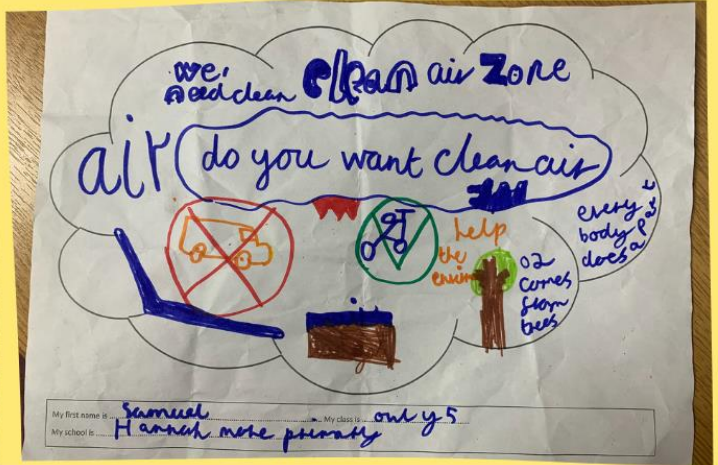
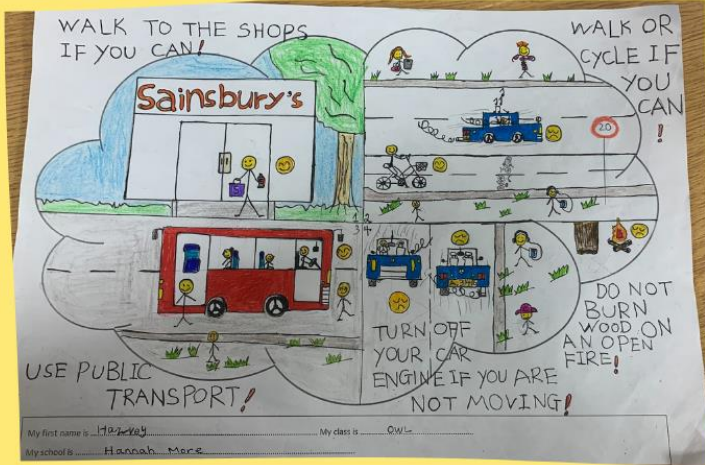

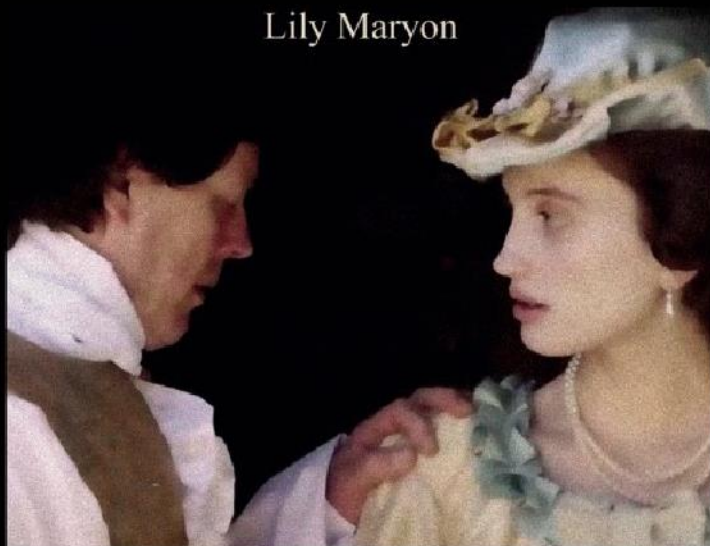

apply for a **secondary school** place for the school year **2023–2024**

If your child was born between **1 September 2011** and **31 August 2012** you will need to apply for a school place by 31 October 2022.

What do I need to do to apply for a school place?

- Check out the guidance on applying to schools – available at www.bristol.gov.uk/schooladmissions, or by contacting School Admissions. The guidance contains details on how & when to apply, information on each school along with their admissions policy and oversubscription criteria. With the mix of different types of school from Church schools, Foundation schools, Academies, Free Schools and Community secondaries the admissions policy could be different for each school you put as a preference so it's important to ensure you check this carefully.
- Some schools require supplementary forms to be completed as well as the common application form. Make sure you check if this applies to the school(s) you are interested in.
- Visit the schools. All schools hold open days. School websites provide details of open evenings and other events.
- Look at the school's prospectus and its website which are useful sources of information.
- You can name up to three school preferences. We advise you to name more than one school.
- Make sure you apply on-time. The deadline is 31 October 2022.

- The system helps you by checking for errors.
- There is no risk that your application will be lost in the post.
- It is quick and easy to do.
- You will get an immediate email confirming that your application has been received.
- You will receive an email notification of the outcome of your application on the same day as the offer letters are posted.
- The system is available 24 hours a day until the final submission time of midnight on 31 October 2022.
