# What have we been learning?

Reception.... We were very excited to have some real tiny caterpillars arrive in Reception this week! We wrote instructions for how to look after them, observed them closely and drew and wrote about what we noticed. As mathematicians we practised counting back to take away caterpillars that turned into butterflies. At home, ask your child to tell you about the caterpillars and how we need to look after them. Practise subtraction by counting back.

Year 1... This week we wrote the whole story of The Lonely Beast in our own words. We also learnt about money, and on Thursday Elmer class went on a fantastic trip to an art studio in Barton Hill! At home, read with your child every night, practise using money with them and talk to them about their trip.

Year 2...This week we acted out scenes from our book Anna Hibiscus and wrote a fantastic diary entry. As mathematicians we learnt all about telling the time. At home, please continue to read with your child every day. Practise telling the time with them.

Year 3... This week as mathematicians we continued to learn about how we can represent information in bar charts or tables. As authors we wrote persuasive letters linked to our story about Mr Stink. At home, please read with your child and ask them questions about the book they are reading. Also encourage your child to practise their times tables.

Year 4... This week we have done lots of work around shape- in particular we identified different types of triangles and quadrilaterals. We have also been considering characters' points of view and have written some fantastic diary entries. Practice homework spellings at home to prepare for your spelling test.

Year 5... This week we wrote setting descriptions of the woods and a badger's set, from our story 'Animals of Farthing Wood'. In maths, we revised our knowledge of angles and learned how to use a protractor accurately. The year 5 children are getting ready for their dance performance in front of the whole school! At home, please support your child to practise how to measure angles accurately, using a protractor.

Year 6... This week we explored probability further as mathematicians, wrote a narrative from our class book 'The Arrival' as authors and tested out hypotheses as scientists! We also showed improvements in our swimming skills this week and started to talk about our end-of-term Year 6 performance! Kestrel were finally able to go to IntoUniversity this week to think about Year 7. At home, please ensure your children completes their homework to a high standard - in readiness for secondary school.
