Reception made their own robots to use to practise reading words. We enjoyed the books 'Not a box' and 'Not a stick' and used our imaginations to think what our boxes could be. As Mathematicians we practised 'more' and 'fewer' and used our number fans and 5 frames to show amounts. Help at home by reading as often as possible—either the books in your book bag or on Bug Club. Remember to read each book 3 times to develop fluency. See the video on Tapestry for more about reading books.



The year 1 adults have been very impressed with all the work completed by children at school and at home. This week we learnt to complete more challenging addition sums using the 'counting on' method. We also learnt the story of Dip Dap.

You can help at home by counting from 1-20 and reading the books on Bug Club - and answering simple questions about the text.

## Year 2

This week we continued to learn about multiplication in maths. In English, children wrote fantastic character descriptions to describe Traction Man. In Enquiry, we thought about the properties of materials and learnt some tricky vocabulary! You can help at home by going on Times Tables Rockstars to help your child get fluent in their 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Read every day on Bug Club!



This week as authors the children wrote some fantastic descriptions of Viking heroes and dangerous settings. As mathematicians we started to explore money. Please make sure your child is reading 5 times a week on Bug Club. Let us know if you need help logging in. Make sure your child is on time for our daily learning calls in the morning and the afternoon!



This week we explored volume and pitch as scientists, learning all about the vibrations of sound waves! As Authors, we wrote from the perspective of Varjak and discussed what he would do next! We are getting much quicker on our times tables as mathematicians and we also learnt some written methods for multiplication and division. Help at home by practising times tables as much as possible and reading together with your child. Don't forget to do lots of activities on Bug Club and Times Tables Rockstars!

Yay! Everyone now has their Chromebooks and we have had a largely very successful first week using Google Classroom. We have been so impressed with the attendance and effort. This week, we learnt about Isaac Newton and created some amazing fact files about him. We also improved our computer skills. Help at home by making sure your children are completing the online learning fully and are at the meetings on time.

We've had a great first week on Google Classroom with almost every child fully engaged in their online learning (as well as the at-school learners working extremely hard!). As mathematicians, we learned to calculate with decimal numbers. As authors, we explored the character of William and rewrote a part of the Floodland story in our own words. As engineers, we learned to use a range of computing software to support our work. Help at home by asking your child to show you all the new computing skills they have learned this week.
