CLASS NEWS

YEAR 1

This week we enjoyed Sports Day!! We competed in different races and cheered on our friends. We then wrote about our day to practise writing in the past tense. Please practise reading with your child. Use the phonics homework to practise identifying sounds in words. Practise doubling! E.g. 'double 4 is the same as $4 + 4$. Double 4 is 8. Have a rest!!

YEAR 2

Year 2 had an exciting week - Sports Day, a class treat and a delicious hot chocolate treat! They finished their work on time and wrote a recount of the recent trip to the park. Please read with your child 5 times a week. Use Bug Club. Ask your teacher if you have forgotten your login. Practise your 2, 5 and 10 times table including doing them out of order.

YEAR 3

What an eventful week Year 3 have had. Two Sports Days and two performances! Every child did fantastically and all the Year 3 adults are very proud. We also had our last swimming lesson and started to learn the time in maths. Please read with your child 5 times a week. Learn the 3, 4 and 8 times table facts out of order. Practise joined handwriting at home.

YEAR 4

As mathematicians this week, we completed our work on decimal numbers, rounding them to the nearest whole and identifying numbers which represent a half and a quarter. In our writing, we completed our graphic novels. In enquiry, we built some very successful electronic games as engineers. At home, make sure your child completes their 12 Soundcheck Challenge over the holidays - there is a chocolate bar reward for everyone who does!

YEAR 5

This week as mathematicians, Year 5 learnt how to plot and translate points on coordinate grids. As authors, they edited and published their most ambitious writing in Year 5 yet! As athletes, all the children had a busy time with Sports Days. At home, help your child with their homework and spellings ready for our Monday test and practise times tables. Encourage your child to read over the half term as well!

YEAR 6

Despite being the last week of term, Year 6 are still hard at work. The children wrote exciting and tense narratives - making sure to use lots of different punctuation! They did extremely well at Sports Day and showed excellent perseverance. At home, read with your child for 20 minutes a day.

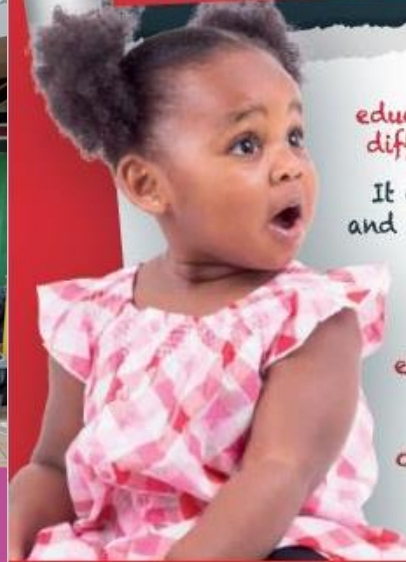
