What have we learnt this week?

Reception

This week farmer Nick visited us to show us how to look for air sacks in the eggs. The children had a lot of questions to ask the farmer about how to look after the chicks when they hatch. This week our caterpillars have made cocoons and we hope they will turn in to butterflies soon. We have also been practising writing our super sentences. At home, continue practising to write those tricky words (in homework books).



Year 1

This week we made pirate hats, patches and treasure maps. In numeracy, learnt our times tables and worked on our mental maths. In topic we learnt about the Wright Brothers and arranged different forms of air travel, in time order. At home, please read with your child and ask them lots of questions based on the text.



Year 2

Eid Mubarak to all those who celebrated Eid! We started looking at poems in literacy and the children wrote poems about bubbles and a magic box. In maths we learnt about 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. At home, please practise spellings with your children.

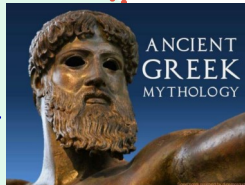
Year 3

We learned about ancient Egyptian tombs that were inside pyramids. In literacy, we planned and wrote our own stories about a goodie beating a baddie. In maths, we learnt all about right, acute and obtuse angles as well as thinking about adding up money. At home, ask your child to explain acute, obtuse and right angles.



Year 4

This week, we have been writing our own Greek myths as we continue to explore ancient Greece; comparing what they did for entertainment and what we do now. We were lucky enough this week to be the first people ever to try out IntoUniversity's brand new workshop all about creative careers. The kids loved it! At home, test your children on converting pounds and pence and also converting hours and minutes e.g. how many pence in £8? How many minutes in 3 hours?



Year 5

In Numeracy, we revised finding the perimeter and area of squares and rectangles. Then we challenged ourselves to do this with rectilinear shapes! In Literacy, we wrote stories based on a spell linked to our class text 'Frogspell'. In Topic, we wrote a discussion text on whether the traders during the Transatlantic Slave Trade were considered bad people or not. At home, please support your child to practise the long multiplication written method.

Year 6

We have three projects ongoing: a fundraising committee, a leavers' disco and our leavers' performance group. They have been working across the year group collaboratively on these projects. Some children enjoyed a trip to the building site at 3 Glass Wharf with Wates on Wednesday, where we had a behind-the-scenes tour of the site and learnt about construction and the people involved. At home, help your child to bake or buy some cakes for our bake sale on Friday 7th July!
