CLASS NEWS

A piano appeared in our classroom this week. We think the bear from our new story 'The Bear and the Piano' left it for us. We wrote questions about if and enjoyed playing lovely tunes on it too. We also enjoyed using the balance scales to learn about weight this week. At home, please read with your child can write their name correctly. Make sure it starts with a capital letter and the rest of their name is written in lower case.

This week Year 2 started reading Traction Man and thought about his character. We also learnt about the properties of materials in preparation for constructing playground equipment for him. In maths we used our number bonds to add to the next 10s, and adding and subtracting ones. Please read with your child 5 times a week. Practise counting forwards and backwards from 100. Practise counting in 2s, 3s and 5s

This week Year 3 looked at a new book all about the geographic history of the earth. In enquiry we learnt about different types of rocks. Please read with your child 3 times a week at home. Please make sure your child does the homework sheet.

We started our first week back with a trip to the Old Vic Theatre to listen to Jan Blake (storyteller) at a book show. We loved her riddles and stories! We started our new class text 'Fantastic Mr Fox' and continued to consolidate our multiple exchanging in column method as mathematicians. Please read with your child at least 3 times a week. Practise 6 times tables with them or log onto TT Rockstars. Practise putting our spelling words into sentences.

As mathematicians we revised multiplication, mentally multiplying two-digit numbers and using column method. In our writing lessons we explored our new story - The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe - whilst in our enquiry we listened to classical music and imaged the story each song is trying to tell. At home, please help your child learn their scripts!

Year 6 had an excellent start to the term. Year 6 Eagle explored evolution at IntoUniversity and Kestrel dived into long division. At home please ensure your child practises their 10 homework spellings ready for the Thursday test.

CRECHE AVAILABLE



A guide for parents and carers on applying for a primary school place for the school year 2024-2025



What do I need to do to apply for a school place?

- Check the guidance on applying for schools - available at www.bristol. gov.uk/schooladmissions, or by contacting School Admissions. The guidance contains details on how & when to apply, information on each school along with their admissions policy and oversubscription criteria. With the mix of different types of school from Church schools, Foundation schools, Academies, Free Schools and Community schools the admissions policy could be different for each school you put as a preference so it's important to ensure you check this carefully.
- Some schools require supplementary forms to be completed as well as the common application form. Make sure you check if this applies to the school(s) you are interested in.
- Visit the schools. All schools hold open days. Contact the school directly for further details on open days.
- Look at the school's prospectus and its website which are useful sources of information.
- You can name up to three school preferences. We advise you to name more than one school.
- Make sure you apply on-time. The deadline is 15 January 2024.

- The system helps you by checking for errors
- There is no risk that your application will be lost in the post.
- It is quick and easy to do.
- You will get an immediate email confirming that your application has been received.
- You will receive an email notification of the outcome of your application on the same day as the offer letters are posted.
- The system is available 24 hours a day until the final submission time of midnight on 15 January 2024.
