

The swarms are high in the tree at the front of school but there will be a few lower flying bees – they are very unlikely to hurt anyone, but should be left alone.

# What have we been learning?

Reception.... have read and followed instructions to make bread this week, just like the 'Little Red Hen' in our story. We also tasted different types of bread from around the world. Which was your child's favourite? In maths we subtracted animals that escaped from their pens and calculated how many were left. At home, practise subtraction with toys. eg. You have 8 cars. 5 drive away. How many will be left? Ask your child to draw a picture to show what has happened. Can they write the number sentence?

Year 2...we have explored word problems as mathematicians this week and done a recount of 'The Tin Forest'. As geographers, we explored the continents and oceans. At home, please read with your child every day and practise their times tables with them.

Year 4... We had a fantastic swimming lesson this week and Mr Webster got to see some very brave children swimming in the deep end! We've learnt all about perimeter in maths and are improving our descriptive writing in English! At home, practice your column method by adding and subtracting 3 or 4 digit numbers. Year 1... we have been sequencing pictures from the story 'The Last Tree'. We have also been using a range of punctuation in our sentences. In maths we have been learning to identify directions. At home, teaching your child to know their left and right would be very helpful.

Year 3... It's been another busy week in Year 3. As authors we pretended to be different characters so we can write from their point of view. As mathematicians we continued our topic of measurement and we are still busy learning the songs ready for our performance at the end of the term. At home, encourage your child to practise their times tables and read as often as possible.

Year 5... In English, we drafted our own descriptive poems based on an animal of our choice using different types of figurative language. In maths, we developed skills in calculating the area and perimeter of regular and irregular shapes. In Enquiry, we looked at colour and how powerful it is in carnivals all over the world. At home, please research St Pauls Carnival and write down at least three facts from your research.

Year 6... Phew! Our wonderful Year 6 children are feeling ready for the SATs next week and we have been revising lots of maths, reading and grammar skills in preparation! In our writing we have written a balanced argument about whether graffiti is art or vandalism. At home, make sure your child is rested, relaxed and feeling calm about the SATs next week!
