This week's learning ...

Year 3

Reception

This week we thought about our school rules - *be safe, show respect and be engaged*. We all did a handprint to sign our class charter. We learnt some new sounds and started reading words and even sentences! In maths we compared amounts using the words more, less, fewer and the same. **Ask your child to tell you how we can follow the class rules and make sure you complete your sound book and return to school on Monday.**

Year 1

This week we started our new class book 'The Night Gardener'. We were actors and we acted out the story. We also learnt about writing in the past tense. At home you can practise talking about the past, noticing which words need 'ed' at the end to turn them into past tense e.g. jump \Rightarrow jumped. **Book changing day and PE is now on Wednesday.**

Year 2

Year 2 loved going on their school trip to see the SS Great Britain and the Clifton Suspension Bridge, for our enquiry all about Brunel. We also continued practising adding two digit numbers and started learning to use the partitioning method **Please practise your sounds and reading every night. Practise counting forwards and backwards to 100.**



In maths, we continued learning to use long division. We also learnt to use square and cube numbers and (Mr Cook's personal favourite) the order of operations! In English we learnt how to use colons and applied this in writing about the school. In enquiry we studied Ancient Egyptian mummification practices and began to think about the circulatory system. **You can help at home by getting your children to show you the order of operations.**

This week we continued to read our story 'Krinklekrax' and made a terrifying beast using a lever, which could open and shut its jaws like the crocodile in the book. As mathematicians we worked hard on our times tables. **Please help at home by learning the 3 and 4 times tables and continue to encourage your child to read every day in a fluent voice.**

Year 4

As authors we have practised how to write speech. As mathematicians we learnt about the difference between mm, cm and m - see if you can do some measuring at home! Unfortunately we must now isolate for 2 weeks, so please help at home by completing home learning, reading with your child and encouraging them to practise times tables.

Year 5

In Year 5 we were lucky enough to have our first artist visit from Studio Meraki this week! We also began to learn songs for our performance Annie. In English we started our new class text 'Street Child' - set in Victorian England. **You can help at home by practising some lines for the Annie auditions next week!**




Please do not park here
