

News from the classes...

Reception classes ... This week we thought about how to change the setting of ' 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff' story. In Maths we learnt how to subtract by counting backwards. Please help at home by asking your child to tell you the story of 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'.

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Year 1 ... This week we re-wrote our class story using lots of adjectives and exciting sentence starters. We then challenged ourselves by writing the story from different perspectives; first Handa then the zebra who took the orange. In Maths we have moved on to find one quarter of shapes and numbers. Please continue to support your child and practise counting and writing numbers 50-200 (forwards and backwards).

Year 2 ... In Literacy this week we wrote the story 'How to Catch a Star'. In Numeracy we found fractions of numbers. In topic we designed a healthy sandwich and thought about the packaging. At home, please help your child to complete the fraction homework sheet that was sent home on Thursday.

Year 3 ... This week we started with a fantastic trip to At Bristol where Year 3 learned how the body works. The children had a great time and represented our school impeccably. In Maths we have been finding non unit fractions of amounts and in Literacy we have been writing setting descriptions and even got to meet Mr Wonka for an interview! Please help at home by encouraging your children to learn news words for their writing.

Year 4... In Year 4 we have explored equivalent fractions with fraction walls, bar models and by using our times table skills. We are still immersing ourselves in the story of Leon and the Place Between and using prepositional phrases, Power of Three and onomatopoeia in our writing. In Topic we have asked questions about our heritage and discussed different foods which are typical in our different cultures. At home please do some cooking with your child and discuss different foods from your culture or cultures around the world. Discuss the origins of the food and where the ingredients come from!

Year 5... In Year 5 we have explored equivalent fractions and looked at converting between improper and mixed number fractions using bar models and our times table skills. In Literacy we have been immersed in our new class text— The Iron Man. We performed the story using percussion and drama. In Topic we started to explore our solar system— the Milky Way.

At home please talk to your child about 'The Iron Man'.

Year 6...This week Year 6 have worked with fractions by adding, subtracting and multiplying them. In Literacy we practised how to include expanded noun phrases and relative clauses in our writing. In Topic we learned about the human circulatory system and how the heart works. We enjoyed saying different weather conditions in French and worked extremely hard on practising our spellings this week. At home, please support your child to revise adding, subtracting and multiplying fractions.
