# What have we been learning?

## Year 1

This week Year 1 have written about dinosaurs.

We took our time with our sentences and joined our ideas using 'and.' In maths, we learnt about 2d and 3d shapes.

We also enjoyed a class treat- we loved visiting the cinema to watch the 3D movie - Cars! At home, find different ways to make 10 and 20. For example  $5+5$ ,  $7+3$ ,  $2+8$ , or  $12 + 8$  etc. And practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s



## Year 2

Watch out parents – this week

year 2 wrote instructions on how to turn you into a pie! We also solved tricky missing number problems in maths and learned about some of the special places in India. Please support your child to count coins and make different amounts of money.



## Year 3

In maths we made links between equal groups, repeated addition and multiplication. In English, we learned how to use paragraphs. In topic, we explored maps and used Google Maps to explore our area.



At home, please support your children to learn the three times table.

## Year 4

This week we learned all about the life of a Ugandan child. We also wrote letters to a child in Uganda to tell them a bit about ourselves. In English, we wrote descriptions of a magical setting and in maths we practised multiplying and dividing numbers by 0, 1, 10 and 100. At home, please support your child to practise the 6 times table.



## Year 5

This week in year 5 we worked on structuring paragraphs around a specific sub-heading and linking the ideas within the paragraphs. We also experimented with the friction of different surfaces and measured the weight and mass of objects around the classroom.

At home, please make sure your child continues to read at least 3 times a week.



## Year 6

This week we focussed on using our mathematical vocabulary. In literacy, we learned how to use a colon correctly and then used this to write a recount of our trip last week. In topic, we learned about the cost split of a banana and then compared the lives of two groups of farmers- Kuapa Kokoo and non-Kuapa Kokoo. Please help at home by getting your child to read for 20 minutes every night and making a note in their reading records.
