What have we been learning?

Year 1

In numeracy this week we solved adding and taking away word problems. In literacy we prepared to write an information text about our very own creature. In PSHE this we designed posters to keep us safe and we really enjoyed a visit from the fire brigade. You can help at home by talking to your child about where they live as we are learning about the local area. Could you help them to learn their address?

Year 4

This week year 4 created a fact file about an African animal using notes and information from the internet. In English, we planned and wrote our own fantasy stories based on the story called 'Leon and the Place Between'. In maths, we solved lots of problems using the 9 times tables. At home, please support your child to practise the 7 times table at home.

Year 5

This week in year 5 we researched and wrote our own biography about Isaac Newton. In topic we learnt about air resistance and its relation to gravity and made parachutes using plastic bags and string to use in an experiment next week. In maths we looked at area and perimeter.

At home, ask your child what they have learned about Isaac Newton.

Year 2

In numeracy this week we solved money problems. In literacy we learnt how to use adverbs, conjunctions and speech marks in our sentences. In topic we have compared our school to a school in an Indian village. You can help at home asking your child to write a sentence with the conjunction whilst'.

Year 3

This week Year 3 went on a local area walk. We got the train to Stapleton road and then walked back to school, looking for what Bristol has to offer to visitors!

In Maths we worked on our 4x tables, practising our multiplying and in English we invented our own recounts! At home, please help your child to practise three, four and eight times table multiplication & division facts.

Year 6

This week year 6 learned how to divide fractions and apply all their learning to word problems. In English, we learned how to write precise speech and how to use different clause starters. In topic, we designed our own chocolate bar using our imaginative skills. At home, please support your child to submit a comment on the class blog.
