Welcome back everyone. Children have got straight down to work, exploring their new enquiries. Please speak to your children about the learning that is going on in their classes.


Reception classes enjoyed a numeracy show on Wednesday and it was lovely to see some parents there as well. Keep looking for those numbers all around you!

# What have we been learning?

**Reception....** We really enjoyed watching a play by a special visitor all about using numbers in our everyday life. We practised our counting and measuring. We also learnt to create repeated patterns.

**Create repeated patterns around your home.** (For example, if you have some oranges and apples, put them in a row - apple, orange, apple, orange. Ask your child what comes next in the pattern.)

**Year 2...** This week we started our new book Zeraffa Giraffa and, using objects from the story, we wrote our adventure tale. As mathematicians we looked at mass and how much the things around us weigh. **At home, how about some weighing activities? And please read with your child every day.**

**Year 4...** This week we started swimming and we are already excited to go back next week. We have started a new text called Frogspell and are exploring the question 'What is Creativity?' in Enquiry. We will let you know what we find out next week. **At home, help your child to practise dividing numbers by 10.**

**Year 5 ...** This week the children learned about the Amazon rainforest as part of their novel study in English. In maths they revised understanding numbers with 2 decimal places. In enquiry, they started their new enquiry question 'Where is our twin?' learning about twin cities using their map skills. **Help at home by supporting your child to learn about the Amazon Rainforest.**

**Year 3...** It's been an exciting week back for Year 3. As scientists, we planted some broad beans ready for our terms enquiry. As authors we began to explore a new book called James and the Giant Peach and as mathematicians we have been securing our knowledge of fractions! **Read with your child every evening. Remind them to bring their book in if it needs changing. Ask them questions about their learning. Remind your child to bring PE kit for a Thursday afternoon.!**

**Year 6...** In maths we learned how to find the area of rectangles and triangles. In English we explored our new book Floodlands. We also have tested children this week – they will tell you their results next week! **Please help at home by having a look at your child's homework with them – we will now be giving them practice test questions as homework.**
