What have we been learning?

Year 1

This week in year 1 we learnt to count forwards and backwards to 100, and wrote our own stories with goodies and baddies! We enjoyed learning about Diwali this week – and thinking about our own special times. We enjoyed climbing on board the life bus and learning about how to keep fit and healthy. At home, please read every day for 15 minutes during the holidays, and ask your child questions about the book. Practice counting to 100 as well.

Year 3

This week we learned to mentally adding and subtracting tens and hundreds to three-digit numbers. In English we looked at the poem 'Don't' by Michael Rosen and wrote our own poems. In reading, we studied the books of Jeremy Strong. Help at home by practising adding and subtracting tens and hundreds to three-digit numbers (eg. 345-30; 426+100)

Year 5

In English this week we looked at newspaper reports and created one on the subject of the saga of Biorn. In Maths we used inverse operations to solve word problems and estimating answers. We also started making our own Viking Longboats using the design from last week in our Topic lessons. Please help your child to revise the 4, 6 and 8 times tables.

Year 2

In Maths this week we have been adding and subtracting numbers and in English the children wrote a recount of the Great Fire of London. The Year 2 team are extremely proud of the children this week as they performed 'The Pied Piper' with such enthusiasm and remembered all the lines. Please help your child to learn the spellings that they will be learning next term.

Year 4

This week we revisited writing a 'good beats bad' story in English! In Maths we did some work with Roman Numerals which we found really interesting. This week Year created their own illustrations for books and used watercolours to make it look more engaging and eye-catching. At home please support your child with learning their 3, 4, 6 and 8 times tables!

Year 6

This week we were lucky enough to receive a visit from our local PCSOs — Matt and Amie — who answered lots of our questions! Year 6 also visited the Life Bus this week which taught us about not giving in to peer pressure. It has been our 'Reading for Pleasure' week too; we have been exploring Eoin Colfer's novels in more depth. Help at home by continuing to practise times tables— it is a really important skill to carry children through the year.
