Next week we also have a special Pyjama Storytime on Thursday evening (with hot chocolate and biscuits!) and children can dress up as book characters on Friday.





Reception.... We learnt about the story of the Little Red Hen and what he needed to do to make bread. We had a visit from Farmer Nick who delivered some eggs and an incubator! We are excited to see what will happen! In Maths, we have been learning about doubling numbers. Please help your child to read the Bug Club books and to practise doubling number e.g. 3+3=6, 5+5=10

What have we been learning?

Year 2...In English, we created animal monsters! We also learnt how to ask questions to find out more. In Maths, we learnt how to carefully count the sides and vertices of shapes. In Topic we learnt about food chains. You can help at home by looking for and naming 2D shapes around the house.

Year 4... This week Year 4 had a visit from Captain Purplebeard to introduce our new English story called 'The Pirate Cruncher'. In Maths, we learned how to add and subtract fractions with the same denominator. In Topic, we learned all about different states of matter: solids, liquids and gases. At home, please practise spelling words in different ways. Year 1...This week we looked at the story Jack and the Beanstalk. We also enjoyed acting out different scenes and creating actions. In Numeracy we compared and ordered different numbers. We had a great time visiting Bristol Zoo Gardens, where we enjoyed learning about different plants and animals. At home, count forwards and backwards in 2s, 5s and 10s.

Year 3... In Maths, we looked at tables and bar charts and information we can gain from these! In English, we learnt our new Non-fiction text all about Chameleons and in Topic we looked at the climates of different places in the world and researched where rainforests are found. At home, please talk to your child about what they have learned in their rainforest topic so far.

> Year 5... In English and Guided Reading this week we started to explore our new class text 'Street Child'. In Maths, we looked at comparing fractions using the bar model and common denominators. At home, talk to your child about how everyday objects could be split up into pieces or 'fractions'.

Year 6... Kestrel and Eagle have been doing different things this week! Kestrel read the start of their new novel Beetle Boy. They explored the language, acted out the opening section and planned a newspaper report based on the missing Beetles. In their first topic lesson, they classified human characteristics. Eagle have been busy at IntoUniversity. They learned about our ancestors and enjoyed a trip to the Zoo before finishing the week with their Into University graduation at The University of Bristol. Check out Twitter for a few pictures! At home, ask your child about characteristics that we inherit, characteristics we get from our environment and characteristics that are influenced by both.
