What have we been learning?

Year 1... This week we learnt how to subtract. We used raisins and cubes first, but have now moved on to pictures and writing number sentences. In Enquiry this week we learnt about Princess Campbell; an important person in Bristol's history. Please make sure you read with your child every day, and practise counting to 20.

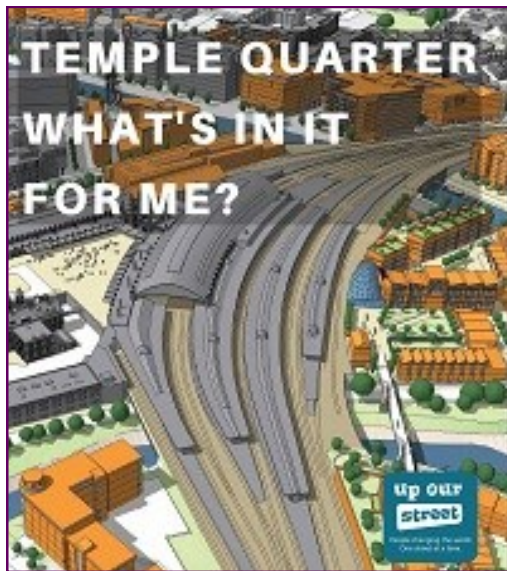
Year 2... This week we revisited addition and subtraction in maths. We also began reading our new book – The Robot and the Bluebird. To kick off our enquiry on healthy eating we also made pizzas this afternoon! Make sure your child knows how to solve addition, subtraction, division and multiplication questions.

Year 4... This week year 4 enjoyed an exciting trip to the SS Great Britain, where we started our Arts Award. We also practised our map reading skills by using atlases to find different countries around the world, and information about them. At home, please practise speedy times tables!

Year 5 ...This week we learned about editing our writing and making it sound better. We focused on correcting spellings, punctuation and grammar and also improving words. In maths we practised multiplying and dividing numbers by 10, 100 and 1000. At home, ask your child to practise their lines for our school play at the end of this term.

Year 3...This week has been a week of new learning in Year 3. In Writing we began our new story Krindlekrax, in Maths we moved onto multiplication and division and in Enquiry we started to think about what is under our feet... It's all very exciting and there is lots of wonderful learning already happening! Read at home with your child and ask them questions about what they are reading. Remind your child to bring their PE kit for Tuesday afternoon and to wear warm outdoor PE kit on Wednesday mornings.

Year 6... On Tuesday, we went to the LifeSkills centre, where we learnt how to react in an emergency, how to be safe in different situations and how to keep our homes safe. Eagle class did some science experiments at Unit DX - Kestrel class will visit next week. We also continued our work on fractions and wrote persuasive letters using formal language. At home, test your child regularly on the spellings we send home with the homework and make sure homework is completed.

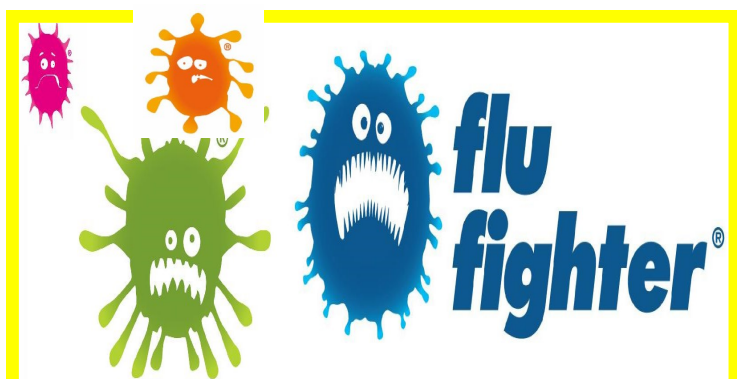
