Lavender This week we learnt all about adjectives and looked at how we can use our five senses to describe nouns. In maths we learnt our number bonds to 10, plus some very catchy songs to help us remember them! Help at home by using adjectives to describe items around your home, like 'blue cup' 'soft teddy' 'shiny spoon'. Make sure you practise your number bonds to ten too! Remember to watch the videos on the Lavender class blog page, and don't forget to log in to EPIC books to read a story.

Reception We have had a good start to the new term! We learnt new tricky words and our first 'trigraph'! Super sentence dog came to help us write super sentences with finger spaces and full stops. As mathematicians we combined two groups to find how many altogether (addition). Please read your reading books! Remember to read each book 3 times to develop confidence and fluency. Look out for digraphs and tricky words. You can use bug club or collect new books from the office if you haven't already.

We have been very busy learning about our new book 'Toys In Space.' In maths we learnt numbers to 50 and thought about different ways to represent a number. We also looked at new / old toys and had lots of fun in our lovely new outside area. Help at home by talking about your daily routine and the order of your day. For example: First I get up, then I eat breakfast etc.

Year 2 This week both the children online and at school really impressed us with how quickly they settled back into work. We started a new enguiry called 'What is home?' and started to learn about different habitats. We also started our new book Zeraffa Giraffa and came up with our own creative ideas about the story! Please make sure your child is reading on bug club DAILY. Log in to TTRS and practise your times tables. Make sure you are on time for our daily learning calls in the morning and the afternoon.

This week we started our new enquiry 'What did John Cabot do for Bristol?' and drew John Cabot, read about him and explored his journey. Children at home and at school impressed teachers with how guickly they settled back into work - well done. Please make sure your child is reading 5 times a week on bug club. Let us know if you need help logging in. Make sure your child is on time for our daily learning calls in the morning and the afternoon.



This week we started to read our new book called Song of the Dolphin Boy – ask your child what it is about so far! As mathematicians, we persevered really well when we were finding our fractions work a little tricky. As scientists we learnt about the differences between solids, liquids and gases. Help at home by practising times tables as much as possible and reading together with your child. Don't forget to do lots of activities on your Bug Club and TT Rockstars!

This week we started reading 'The Explorer' and found out all about the Amazon. 'V' GOIP 5a new enquiry, 'What is Chocolate?'. As historians, we researched Ancient Mayan Civilizations and considered the importance of chocolate to the Mayan people. Please make sure your child is reading regularly on Bug Club. Make sure you take part in next week's Timestable Rockstars challenge against Year 4.



This week has been all about the Ancient Greeks. We learnt about how their lives were deeply rooted in their belief in the gods and shared

information about the different gods. We also started reading our new novel, the Adventures of Odysseus, which is based on the Greek write Homer's poem about King Odysseus' journey home from the Trojan war. In maths we started to do algebra: using letters to represent missing amounts and continued some work on fractions. At home, talk to your child about how they feel about coming back to school on March the 8th. What are they looking forward to? Is there anything they are worried about?
