
Hannah More Primary School Newsletter

Reception classes ... This week we learnt all about Pirates!! On Tuesday we dressed up as Pirates. We made eye patches and telescopes and then set off on a treasure hunt in the beach area! In literacy we learnt 'The Story of Pirate Tom' and practised directions and positional language in maths. Please read 'The Story of Pirate Tom' with your child and ask them to use the story map to retell it in their own words, with actions. PLEASE RETURN SOUND BOOKS ON MONDAYS AND BRING BOOK BAGS IN EVERY DAY. Many thanks.

- Year 1 ... This week in literacy we created our own stories, using our own ideas. In Numeracy we found the missing numbers in a number sentence. We also learnt to tell the time (o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past). We enjoyed special circle time activities this week, where we have talked about our families and what makes a special friend. At home, please help your child log on to bug club and read some of the special books which have been allocated to them. Please make sure you answer the comprehension questions as well!
- Year 2... This week in our numeracy we practised naming and describing 2 dimensional shapes. In Literacy we wrote our own quest stories. At home, please look out for 2D shapes (circle, square, triangle etc.) and 3D shapes (sphere, cube, cuboid, pyramid etc.).
- **Year 3** ... This week we practised telling the time, using analogue and digital clocks. We learnt to read and write the time as well! In Literacy we wrote our own 'Rags to Riches' stories.

 At home, please practise telling the time with your child, to the nearest 5 minutes.
- **Year 4** ... This week we invented our own fantasy story! We also learned about equivalent fractions and started to compare these. In topic, we learned about prey, predators and producers. We created our own food chains and discussed energy transfer. **At home, please talk to your children about food chains!**
- **Year 5**... This week we planned our innovated mystery story and rehearsed it as well In Maths we solved lots of word problems involving fractions and moved onto ordering and converting decimal numbers. Year 5 LSAs and teachers are feeling extremely proud this week because th children behaved really well without their usual teachers for 2 days. Well done! **You can help at home by reading a book ready to share with the class**.
- **Year 6** ... Eagle class have been finding the area, perimeter and volume of different shapes in maths this week while Kestrel have been using and converting metric measurements. In literacy, Eagle have written discussion texts and Kestrel have practised formal letter writing. We have also been working sensibly in our SRE lessons. At home please practise vital times-table facts for five minutes EVERY DAY with your child, to help prepare for the upcoming SATs.
