What have we been learning?

Reception ... We have really settled into fulltime school this week and have thoroughly enjoyed learning and playing inside and outside. We also talked about our families and about special occasions. Please talk to your child about what they have enjoyed. Make sure all your child's belongings are named!

Year 2

This week we wrote diary entries where we pretended to be Traction Man! We also explored different materials around the school and as mathematicians we practised our addition and subtraction. At home please practise addition and subtraction with objects round the house as well as helping your child count backwards from 50. Continue to read with your child at home every day.

Year 4 ... This week we continued our enquiry 'What is the difference between noise and sound?' To support this enquiry we welcomed Ruth, who showed us some of her fascinating instruments, and even let us have a go! At home, please practise spellings in different ways. **Year 1** ... This week we made wizard hats and wands and practised using adjectives in our writing. We also did some experiments for our Enquiry. We tested different materials to make a bridge and learnt new words to describe the properties of these materials. At home please count forwards and backwards to 20, and think about the concept of one more and one less.

Year 3

This week we wrote our own short stories and learnt lots of new vocabulary. We consolidated our knowledge of numbers up to 1000 and looked at paintings from the past in our enquiry lessons. Please support your child with their homework over the weekend and remind them to bring it to school on Monday.

Year 5 ...This week we explored day and night during our enquiry lessons. In maths, we practised reading and writing numbers up to one million as well as comparing and ordering them. In English we wrote a summary of what has happened in Cosmic so far as well as writing formal letters in the role of a character. Please help at home by helping your child to practise the weekly spellings on the homework sheet.

Year 6 ... This week, we looked in detail at some of the language features of a newspaper report such as relative clauses and direct and reported speech. Today the children started writing their own newspaper reports based on Beetle Boy. In Maths, we compared and ordered numbers and are now rounding too! We looked outside at some living organisms and classified them as Linneus would! At home, please ask children to classify living organisms when out and about with them!
