

Reception It has been great to see so much lovely learning from home this week. Children have been really engaged in

Zoom sessions. As mathematicians we have used a part part whole model to explore different ways of making 5 and 4. In phonics we have been read and written words and sentences. We are getting really good! Keep going with your learning at home each day, you are all doing so well. Remember to try and read every day and enjoy stories together. You can collect new reading books on a Wednesday. Use bug club too.!


This week we learnt how to write instructions, including time connectives 201 and verbs. We also wrote our own recipes. At school we wrote recipes for fruit kebabs and at home we wrote recipes for fruit smoothies. Help at home by learning your number bonds to 10/20, finding out about Hannah More and learning year 1 tricky words!

Year 2 We have been fantastic authors this week, retelling an adventure in Traction Man. As mathematicians, we explored division as sharing. In enquiry we thought about what materials are best suited for making different things, taking into account their different properties. Now that bug club is up and running, please make sure your child is reading 5 times a week. Let us know if you need help logging in. Make sure you're on time for daily zoom calls both in the morning and the afternoon. It is important to keep school links going as much as possible in these tricky times.

This week as authors we wrote some fantastic Quest Stories using lots of imagination and creativity! As mathematicians we started to add and subtract money and learnt how to give change. Please make sure your child is reading

home by practising times tables as much as possible and reading together with your child. Don't forget to do lots of activities on Bug Club and TT Rockstars!

Yay! Everyone now has their Chromebooks and we have had a largely very successful first week using Google Classroom. We have been so impressed with



the attendance and effort. This week, we learnt about Isaac Newton and created some amazing fact files about him. We also improved our computer skills. Help at home by making sure your children are completing the online learning fully and are at the meetings on time.



We are thrilled that everyone has engaged in their learning at home this week! We have written water poems, worked with decimals and created presentations about renewable energy in Bristol. The children in school also made window hangers to give to people they appreciate as an act of kindness – they were excellent.
