What have we been learning?

Year 1... We started our new book 'The Snail and the Whale' and described the different settings. As mathematicians, we learnt about place value and how many tens and ones are in different numbers. We also had an exciting craft afternoon with Burges Salmon volunteers! Please read with your children at home.

Year 2... This week we started looking at money as mathematicians and we retold the story of The Robot and the Bluebird from the robot's point of view. As scientists we looked at the benefits of exercise and how to create food chains. Please look with your child at different coins and notes. Show them how you pay with money in shops and then change your receive.


Year 4... This week in year 4 we used the features of tension in our writing to keep our readers in suspense... We are super proud of the wonderful writing outcomes. We are also lucky to have taken part in a conductive music session where we learnt all about composing and even performed! At home, please practise for your spelling test - they are every Thursday!

Year 5 ...this week we learned about the formal written method for multiplication. In English, we re-wrote a battle scene and included more description and speech to make it more interesting to read. In Enquiry, the children learned about the Mayans beliefs. At home, please support your child to practise their lines for our performance.

Reception.... We practised using the sounds we have learned to read and write short words. In maths, we counted and made numbers to 10 in different ways – using numicon, tens frames and bead-strings. Ask your child to practise reading short words in their phonic books by saying the sounds and using 'robot arms' to blend. Practise 'careful counting' asking your child to count how many pencils, apples, cups etc. at home. Can they show the same number of fingers?

Year 3...This week has been a week of new learning in Year 3. In Writing we began our new story Krindlekrax, in Maths we moved onto multiplication and division and in Enquiry we started to think about what is under our feet.... It's all very exciting and there is lots of wonderful learning already happening! Read at home with your child and ask them questions about what they are reading. Remind your child to bring their PE kit for Tuesday afternoon and to wear warm outdoor PE kit on Wednesday mornings.

Year 6... In maths we learned to multiply and divide fractions. In English we wrote discussion texts. In enquiry we learned about the different parts of the heart and how to keep it healthy... Ask your children what the different operations with fractions involve (adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing).
