What have we been learning?

Reception.... This week we continued to learn the story of 'The Little Red Hen' and practised using bead strings to add numbers together in maths. We had a fantastic trip to the farm which we all enjoyed. We were all very proud of how sensible the children were. Thanks to all the adults who came along to help out. **At home, ask your child to tell you all about what they saw at the farm. Practise adding e.g. 4 apples, 6 oranges – how many altogether?**

Year 2... we began to explore 'The Tin Forest' this week. creating a list poem to describe the old man's dream and writing a character description of him. As mathematicians we explored word problems. **At home, please read with your child every day and practise times tables!**

Year 4... The scientists in year 4 have been designing and conducting exciting experiments this week. We answered the question 'Which materials are insulators?' and we can tell you lots of fascinating facts about our research! **At home, practise your homework spelling list for your test next week.**

Year 6... As mathematicians, we improved our reasoning skills this week, particularly around times -tables and calculating area. As authors, we wrote a report about graffiti and are now preparing to write a balanced argument. The children have worked really hard to continue to prepare for their SATs. **At home, please continue to motivate and encourage your child . Thank you for your support – they have worked very hard!**

Year 1... this week we learnt how to find half and quarter of a shape/number. We also wrote letters and identified the different features of a letter. We also enjoyed making posters and learning about different plants and trees. **At home, please look at the local area and think about ways in which we can look after and protect our trees.**

Year 3... It's been a busy week in Year 3. As authors we've explored more of our adventure text, as mathematicians we have started our new topic of measurement and as musicians we have begun learning the songs ready for our performance at the end of the term. **At home, encourage your child to practise their times tables and read as often as possible.**

Year 5... In English, we wrote our own descriptive poems based on a carnival animal, using different types of figurative language. In maths, we revised our knowledge of finding the perimeter and area of different shapes. In Enquiry, we started learning about what the word 'carnival' means and what carnival looks like in different countries. **At home, can you watch some carnival videos online and discuss the different costumes and colours used?**
