This week's learning... Reception classes ... In Maths this week some children learnt how to halve objects and numbers. Other children learnt how to make a sensible estimation and check their n estimation by counting. In Literacy children learnt the story The Gruffalo. They also visited 2 the Hub to hear the story Peter Pan. Please play the number ordering game http:// www.topmarks.co.uk/ordering-and-sequencing/caterpillar-ordering. Year 1 ... Year 1 really enjoyed Book Week! Our favourite part was visiting the Hub (which had turned into Neverland) and creating a Peter Pan puppet show. At home, please ask your child to identify 2D and 3D shapes in the home and out and about. Q J Year 2 ... This week we thought about books and book characters that we like. We wrote book reviews and character profiles in Literacy. We learned about friendships in the Life Bus and how to sort out problems between friends. At home, please practise addition and subtraction of 2 digit numbers with your child. Year 3 ... Book week has been fabulous! We found a story with no ending so the children wrote their own invented story ending. In Maths we found angles of shapes and learnt about parallel and perpendicular lines. Year 3 also enjoyed learning about S S life in the jungle and wrote amazing diary entries as an Amazonian child. Finally, we enjoyed learning about the brain in the life bus. At home, please write an exercise S S diary as we are trying to improve our fitness! 2 Year 4... We are busy planning an exciting experiment to see which materials make good conductors of electricity. We can't wait to build our circuits and find out! Book Week has been lots of fun and we have been immersing ourselves in a lovely book called 'Dogs Don't Do Ballet'. We have been noticing symmetry in Numeracy and creating our own symmetrical patterns. Sometimes it can be tricky trying to visualise shapes so we have been using mirrors to help us. At home please talk to your child about how to stay 8 🦠 safe around electricity. STORE OF THE PERSON OF THE PER Year 5... This week we learnt all about the properties of shapes and used Mathematical STATE OF THE PARTY 🔌 language in our discussions. In Literacy we reviewed our favourite books and presented them in an interesting way to the rest of the class. We visited the Life Bus on Monday and learnt all about what it means to be assertive and how to say 'no'. In our topic we looked at similarities and differences between Victorian schools and modern schools. At home, please ask your child to describe 2D and 3D shapes around them, using language such as: parallel, perpendicular, vertices and so on! Year 6...This week year 6 have found the area and perimeter of rectilinear shapes. In Literacy we discussed our favourite books and favourite authors linked to our Book Week Q V theme. We enjoyed a Life Bus workshop on peer pressure and the effects of alcohol and National designs on health. At home, please help your child to practise their spellings from their spelling list.
