What have we been learning?

Reception...This week we learnt about the Hindu festival Diwali. We learnt how it is celebrated and thought about how we celebrate our own special festivals. We thought about how important light is and we made special lamps to hold candles.

Your child has been given a 'Phonics Book'. The words in this book are made up of the sounds we have learnt. Please look at the book with your child and ask them to say the sounds they know. See if they can read the words and tell the story. The books will be changed every Friday.

Year 3...We started a new enquiry to answer the question 'Where does darkness come from?' We have been scientists and learnt about sources of light and how light travels. As mathematicians we continued to learn about using the column method for adding and subtracting. Please remind your child to bring in their **PE kit on Tuesdays** for PE in the afternoon and **wear their PE kit to school on Wednesdays**, bringing school clothes to change into.

Year 5 ...This week we started reading our novel 'Narnia'. We are really enjoying the fantasy of being in a wintry place and have written descriptive poems about Narnia. In maths we revised our knowledge of multiples and learned all about factors – our times tables really helped us with this learning! At home, ask your child to practise their lines for our school play at the end of this term.

Year 1... We have been very busy this week with lots of visitors! We watched a puppet show about Diwali and the enjoyed the life bus. We had a visit from the police and a nurse as part of our new enquiry question 'who helps who'? In English we started our new book 'Avocado Baby' and we tasted some yummy avocado! Please continue to read at home with your children and practise counting on when adding numbers.

Year 2... This week we solved multiplication problems using arrays. In English we learnt about non-fiction texts and wrote instructions on 'How to Make a Bird Cake'. We also enjoyed watching a puppet show about Diwali. At home, please recap and test your children on their previous spelling lists.

Year 4... This week we started our enquiry 'Why do we live here?', in which we have been thinking about why we love living in Bristol. We have also started our new text 'The Iron Man' and written our own descriptive poems. At home, please practise times tables up to 12 with your child .

Year 6... As mathematicians, we reduced fractions to their simplest form. As authors, we learned to recognise clauses and phrases. We learned about evolution and adaptation in our trip to Avon Wildlife Feed Centre. We also learned about the Hindu & Sikh festival of Diwali. At home, please help your child with their homework which is to find fractions of amounts.
