# Reception

Reception had great fun this week making their own gingerbread men! Luckily they didn't run away and we got to eat them! In maths we learnt about one more and one less than numbers up to 5. We have learnt our first tricky words too. To help at home - give your child (for example) 3 apples. Ask: How many? If you have one more



Children have done a brilliant job at home learning this week and we have loved seeing them on zoom every day. As mathematicians they have been learning their 4 and 8 times table and as authors and geographers have been exploring volcanoes and earthquakes! Please help your child learn the 3, 4 and 8 times table. Continue to encourage your child to read every day, in a fluent voice.

This week we identified 3D shapes and talked about what they look like. We practised using adjectives in our writing to make it more interesting. Can you find these shapes at home? Look for a cube, cuboid, sphere, cone, pyramid and cylinder. Look in your reading books - can you find any diagraphs in the words you are reading?

Year 2

We had an exciting week making a recount for our class book, The Pirate Cruncher! We also practised our phonics lots this week and counted coins in maths! Please practise your sounds and read every night. Practise counting forwards and backwards to 100. Practise 2 digit addition and subtraction sentences.



We worked so hard this week on our tests and on writing our own story based on Roald Dahl's Fantastic Mr. Fox. As Scientists we learned about classifying animals and used classification keys. As Geographers we thought about the ways habitats change because of things humans do, such as urbanisation, pollution and deforestation. You can help at home by practising times tables with your child.

As artists we used cardboard and other resources to create 3D building. Take a look on twitter, they are incredible! This week, we have also been writing our own play scripts, practising the performance for the final week of term and learning how to multiply two 2 digit numbers together. Please help your child practise their lines for the performance - and learn the song lyrics.

Eagle class learned about the Bristol blitz and university life while at IntoUniversity. Kestrel class wrote explanation texts on mummification as authors. As mathematicians, we simplified and compared proper fractions. We also completed some practice SATs assessments and made delicious pasta bakes! You can help at home by using your child's knowledge of fractions around the house, such as when cooking for example!
