Reception

Reception enjoyed our new story Whatever Next! We designed our own rockets and what we might take to the moon. As mathematicians we learnt all about zero and practised subitising. At home, your child has a new bigger homework book with maths and phonics in. Please return this every Monday. Keep the little 'Sounds Book' to keep practising all your sounds. Keep reading too!

Year 1

This week Year 1 had a lovely virtual session with the teddybear hospital where we learnt about hospitals from a medical students. In math we learnt how to subtract numbers from 20. In enquiry we had an exciting week being historians and learning about Princess Campbell! At home please read every day and count forwards and backwards to 50. Read and write number to twenty.

Year 2

Year 2 had a great week—we went to the park to investigate joins and materials, we decorated cakes for Hannah More's birthday and we acted out new Traction Man stories! Please read with your child 5 times a week, using Bug Club. Ask your teacher if you have forgotten your login. Practise your 2, 5 and 10 times table including doing them out of order.

Year 3

This week Year 3 read biographies and become detectives, identifying the key features. In maths we looked at how information can be collected and shared, and how we can interpret this information. Please make sure your child is reading 5 times a week on Bug Club. Let us know if you need help logging in.

Year 4

As mathematicians children explored the area of shapes for the first time this week. As authors they planned a sequel to the Iron Man. We continued our music creation and our performance practice. At home ask your child to perform their hot air balloon music piece using tools and equipment from around the house.

This week Year 5 wrote and published a non-chronological report all about space—our enquiry this term that we have been very interested in! As mathematicians we continued to work with fractions, using lots of different methods. We enjoyed swimming on Thursday as always and had a great day for Hannah More's birthday! Please practise multiplication tables and weekly spellings.

We enjoyed our story Floodlands again this week, exploring themes and writing poetry. We also flexed our acting muscles with a bit of freeze framing around the battle of the eels and cats! In maths we learnt more about percentages and in science we experimented with electrical circuits. At home please practise multiplication tables and weekly spellings. Our 'respect' focus is about language choices this week. Please be sure to make some time to talk to you child about this over the next few days
