Year 6 – How has our understanding of the human body changed?

This week we were introduced to our new book of the term - 'Toys in Space'. We were captivated by space and created our own telescopes to help us be astronomers! In maths, we wrote our own addition sentences. At home read with your child every day. On a clear night, see if you can see stars and the moon with you child and talk about what you can see.

This week Year 2 started work on our new book 'Pattan's Pumpkin'. We also practised our adding skills and as scientists we started to learn about seeds and plants. Please read with you child 5 times a week. Practise times tables on Times Table Rockstars.

We began our new enquiry 'What is Underneath our Feet' and learnt about the earth as scientists and geographers. We also started our new book 'Pebble in our Pocket' and this really made us look at stones differently! Please read with your child 5 times a week. Learn the 2 and 5 times table facts out of order. Check out the Year 3 blog on our school website to see what we are doing!

As mathematicians we learnt to use column subtraction with one or more exchanges while as authors we explored our new book 'Fantastic Mr Fox', writing our ideas for the next part of the story. In our enquiry - 'Who is a predator? Who is prey?' - we explored different animal characteristics and how teeth are used to different effect! At home ask your child how different teeth are used to do different things to our food.

In the first week of Term 2 we started our new book 'Street Child'. We acted out what characters are thinking/feeling. We began our enquiry 'What goes on behind the scenes?' by being musicians and composed soundscapes! As mathematicians we learnt about factors and common factors. At home help your child with their homework and spellings ready for our Monday test.

In Year 6 this week we explored ancient tombs as Egyptologists - discovering artefacts and deciphering hieroglyphics! We also started reading our new book 'Wolf wilder' and learnt all about where it is set - Russia. At home please help you child by reading with them.

PARENT VOICE

We had a parent voice meeting last term. We started by talking about a **Code of Conduct** that we have been working on. Parents understand that the final version will be shared once it is finalised.

 Parents are wanting reassurance from the school that behavioural issues (including recent playground incidents) are being addressed. Some suggested texts to keep parents updated.

I explained that a lot of work goes on behind the scenes and all behavioural issues are investigated in depth. I also talked about our 'relationship based' behaviour policy and the need to understand where behaviours might come from.

- Parents are understanding that the school wants to support the whole community.
- Publicly criticising or shouting at other people's children is not ok this is the view of parents in the meeting and the school alike.

This features in the new Code of Conduct and shouldn't be happening on the school site.

Learnt behaviour in school can have damaging effect on the behaviour of some students.

We are aware that some behaviours are copied, particularly by younger children. Year 6 are doing a fantastic job of taking responsibility and setting examples. This has had an impact this year.

Bad language from both parents and children needs to stop.

This will feature in the Code of Conduct and is something that we aim to cut down in school. We need help from parents to model positive language at home.

- Over the past 2 years there have been issues between parents that were not properly supported at the time.
- General feeling that the school needs to be stricter with rules etc

Helen and I have spent a lot of time meeting with parents and when there are issues that we are aware of. We will always try to arrange meetings and address them. The Code of Conduct will give structure to this. Our aim is to use the values to positively reinforce the behaviours that we expect.

- A pupil physically attacking an adult has been witnessed by parents. This is an example of behaviour that
 does not seem to come with any obvious consequence.
- Feeling that there is a risk to all pupils and staff in the school in relation to physical behaviour and high needs children.
- Parents have been told that internal exclusion has been put in place in some situations however, parents
 are feeding back that the children are moved into another class which then disrupts another group from
 their learning and children have felt intimidated by this.
- Parents questioning whether suspension should be put in place Kevin has explained that we are using a relationship-based policy at the school so this does not work for every child.

There are a handful of children that display quite extreme behaviours. We use internal exclusions when we feel children won't benefit from being at home. There are always consequences, some of these might not been seen by children in the class. I pointed out that it would be easy to say that extreme behaviour should result in exclusion but research proves it doesn't help in the long run.

- Suggestion of Contracts for pupils/parents/teachers to sign?
- Certificates for good behaviour?
- Could there be a way for parents to communicate issues to teachers/staff before school? These would be
 issues that had happened the day before. Would be beneficial for things to be resolved quicker maybe an e
 mail address that is monitored by one person could be created for this purpose?

We have introduced certificates. The contract idea is something being discussed with the Code of Conduct - a home/school agreement. We are looking at communication between teachers and parents.

Having discussed meeting at 6pm, we felt that this would clash with the time that people eat or start bedtime routines.


