What have we been learning?

Reception.... this week we visited Leigh Woods. We thought of words to describe what we could hear in the woods, we felt the texture of different trees and we spoke about who uses the trees. Back at school we learnt the story of Jack and the Bean Stalk At home, practise reading and writing all the sounds and tricky words we have learnt so far. Year 2... we finished off our newspaper report which retold the event of Zeraffa Giraffa arriving in France. As mathematicians we looked at money and as part of STEM week we learnt all about the journey of a bee. At home, please practise addition (+), subtraction (-), division and multiplication (x) over the holidays - and read every day with your child.

Year 4... what a busy last week of term! We had our final swimming lesson of the term, and had loads of fun splashing around playing games. For STEM week we explored science topics. Please help your child to practice telling the time on an analogue clock.

Year 5... in maths we multiplied and divided whole numbers and decimal numbers by powers of 10 (10, 100, 1000). In English, we wrote our own adventure stories based on 'The Explorer' novel. We enjoyed our Geography and Science activities this week too! At home, support your child to add and subtract numbers mentally. Year 1... have had an exciting week! We worked very hard and were fantastic actors, actresses and singers in our performance 'Hats Off'. For STEM week we were also scientists with Magnetic Maggie and enjoyed watching lots of chemical reactions! We also were engineers and built our own shoe box cars! . At home, read and complete your homework packs over the break!

Year 3... we have had an exciting week! We had a lovely day out at Feed Bristol on Wednesday and learnt lots about plants and seeds. Also as scientists, we carried out an experiment to find out how water travels through plants. At home, encourage your child to read as often as possible and practise a column of times tables. Also, keep asking them what the time is!

Year 6... what a busy week in Year 6! We wrote persuasive letters to Ms Ramsay about helping the school to become more environmentally friendly, we learnt about circles and pie charts as mathematicians and enjoyed our science workshops too!
