Shani has been researching people of colour that travelled on the SS Great Britain and has written a book about it called 'Tying the Tides'. Black history is so important to our diverse school community and the children will be working on the following enquiries with their classes.

Reception - What stories are told around the world?

Year 1 – How did a bus ride make history?

Year 2 – How have black people contributed significantly to sport?

Year 3 – How do you fight for Equality?

Year 4 – Who has made significant changes in Bristol?

Year 5 – Is Bristol built on slavery?

Year 6 – What impact did the Windrush generation have?

This week as mathematicians we continued learning how to add ones Lavender to three digit numbers. As writers we created and wrote sentences using adjectives. At home please read with your child every day and practise adding numbers under 10 to three digit numbers e.g. 345+3, 237+2.

This week we had fun wearing lots of different hats! We wore hard hats, police hats, winter hats, sun hats, crowns and cowboy hats! We thought about what materials we could use to make our own hats and the different ways to stick them together. In maths we are using the vocabulary - more, greater than, less than, equal to. Ask your child what these words mean. Give them a pile of two different items and ask them to talk about the groups using the new vocabulary above. E.g. '2 pieces of fruit and 10 socks - there are a greater number of socks because 10 is bigger than 2)

This week Year 2 began rehearsing for our performance of 'Little Muncher' on the stage! In English we did fantastic retells of the story of 'The Tin Forest' and as mathematicians we looked at splitting numbers into tens and ones. Please read with your child five times a week, practise counting forwards and backwards from 100 and practise writing numbers with your child.

We started the week by having an exciting shadow puppet theatre visit! This will help us with our upcoming shadow puppet shows! As mathematicians we started learning how to exchange when adding ones and tens to three-digit numbers. As authors we compeleted and edited our first big write of the year which is a retell of our book 'Leon and the Place Between'. Please read with your child 5 times a week. Learn the 2 and 5 times table facts out of order. Check out the Year 3 blog on our school website to see what we've been doing! Make sure trip permission slips are in by Monday as we have a trip that day to the Trinity Centre for a theatre production.

As mathematicians, we rounded four-digit numbers to the nearest ten, hundred and thousand. As authors, we used our learning from earlier in the term to write our own ending to Varjak Paw. In our enquiry lessons, we were historians learning about the impact of Ibn Battuta and Al Zahrawi on early Islamic civilisation and the wider world. Please help your child with their 6 times tables as we get ready to start them next week!

This week as historians, we learnt about the history of glass making in Bristol. We had a fantastic trip to Bristol Blue Glass where we learnt about how glass is made and got to experience a real-life glass workshop. As mathematicians we finished our unit on place value, and as authors we started writing a letter about child labour to Bristol City FC. We also had a visit from a theatre show, Abbie Ayre and he Shed of Science, which taught us all about the new Clean Air Zone in Bristol! At home help your child with their homework spellings ready for our Monday test.

This week, Year 6 learnt about how volcanoes create islands and role-played as Charles Darwin's crew aboard HMS Beagle! We hunted for, and found, a variety of flatworms and finches. We drew, measured and recorded our scientific observations. At home please ensure your child practises their Year 5/6 spellings.

If you are interested in a place at this school, you will need to apply separately to Bristol School Admissions (details on the next page) - you can apply for places with school admissions Oasis Academy.

apply for a secondary school place for the school year 2023–2024

If your child was born between 1 September 2011 and 31 August 2012 you will need to apply for a school place by 31 October 2022.

What do I need to do to apply for a school place?

- Check out the guidance on applying to schools – available at www.bristol. gov.uk/schooladmissions, or by contacting School Admissions. The guidance contains details on how & when to apply, information on each school along with their admissions policy and oversubscription criteria. With the mix of different types of school from Church schools, Foundation schools, Academies, Free Schools and Community secondaries the admissions policy could be different for each school you put as a preference so it's important to ensure you check this carefully.
- Some schools require supplementary forms to be completed as well as the common application form. Make sure you check if this applies to the school(s) you are interested in.
- Visit the schools. All schools hold open days. School websites provide details of open evenings and other events.
- Look at the school's prospectus and its website which are useful sources of information.
- You can name up to three school preferences. We advise you to name more than one school.
- Make sure you apply on-time. The deadline is 31 October 2022.

School Uniform

Uniform for girls

- Navy blue cardigan, sweatshirt or fleece, preferably with school logo.
- Plain white blouse or polo shirt.
- Black or dark grey trousers not denim.
- Black or dark grey knee length skirt or pinafore dress - girls may wear black leggings or dark tights with these.
- Blue gingham dress for summer (optional).
- Headscarves or hijabs, if worn, must be navy blue or white.









Shoes

All children should wear black sensible shoes; suitable for playing, climbing and running - football boots, flip flops or high heels are not acceptable for school.







Uniform for boys

- Navy blue jumper or fleece, preferably with school logo
- · Plain white shirt or polo shirt
- Black or dark grey trousers or shorts

PE Kit for boys and girls

- Navy blue or black shorts, leggings or tracksuit bottoms
- · Daps, plimsolls or trainers

House T-Shirts

House t-shirts with the oak, sycamore, beech and chestnut logos can be bought from the school office or online with SIMS Pay.

Children will wear their house t-shirts for PE lessons, sports day and house lunches.



Jewellery
