CLASS NEWS

YEAR 1 As mathematicians, we learnt to name and sort 3D shapes using words 'faces', 'vertices' and 'edges'. As artists, we learnt about Henri Matisse and expressing our opinion about his work. We also learnt the poem 'The sound collector'. You can help your child practise saying and writing their tricky words.

Teap This week Year 2 wrote an explantation text about the playground equipment they designed themselves. In maths, we looked at 2D shapes. WE visited a local church and asked the priest questions to find out all about what happens there. Please read with your child <u>5 times a week.</u> Practise number bonds to 10 - ask your child to teach you the 10s game! Practise counting in 2s, 3s and 5s.

This week Year 3 learnt about non-chronological reports, we researched about how earthquakes and volcanoes happen, whilst using what we learnt already from our enquiry lessons. We learnt about the features and we also started our big writes on it! In maths, we looked at our 2, 4 and 8 times tables. Please read with your child <u>3 times a week</u> at home. Please make sure your child does the homework sheet.

This week, Year 4 wrote their own adapted versions of 'Fantastic Mr Fox'. They enjoyed developing their own characters, settings and plots. As mathematicians, they multiplied three numbers efficiently and found factor pairs. As scientists, they designed their own classification keys to distinguish between the characteristics of animals. Please read with your child <u>at least 3 times a week</u>. See how many factors you can find for numbers between 50-100.

CARS 5 Our performance practice has stepped up a gear as we get ready to perform to you all next week. Outside of this, we used partitioning and short division to divide three-digit numbers. As authors, we wrote emergency diary entries in role as professionals in an occupation of our choice. At home, please ask your child to show off their new skills as mathematicians and authors.

YEEP 6 This week we learnt about new punctuation types - dashes, colons and semi-colons. As mathematicians we worked really hard to add and subtract mixed number fractions. At home please read with your child at least 3 times a week.


PILATES & FITNESS mixed group with tutor Mark Tuesday evenings @ 6:30-1:30

Girls over eight can come along unaccompanied o under eights with female carers. Dads and male carers will be asked to drop off and pick up (as long as the child is 8+).


