This week as authors we learnt all about tigers and created a fact sheet with some interesting information about tigers. Year 2 were busy this week writing their own stories about Anna Hibiscus. In maths they learnt about litres, millilitres and temperature. We finished the week by resting the children's measuring skills when they had to make a cake on their own! Please read with your child 5 times a week. Use Bug Club - ask your teacher if you have forgotten your login. Practise your 3 and 4 times tables, including doing them out of order.

This week Year 3 looked at problem solving mass in maths and wrote 'The Great Kapok Tree from a different perspective. They also had a fabulous celebration with Turner and Townsend, where we created our own sunflowers. Please help your child learn the 3, 4 and 8 times tables. Please continue to encourage your child to read every day in a fluent voice.

Non-campers had a fantastic time playing at castle park and taking part in a scavenger hunt! At home, please make sure your child reads 15 minutes a day and practises their multiplication tables daily.




